

**GUERNSEY STATUTORY INSTRUMENT 2012 No. 19**

**The Control of Intoxicating Liquor (Designated Public Places)  
(Olympic Torch) Order 2012**



Made: 13 February 2012

Coming into force: 15 July 2012

THE STATES HOME DEPARTMENT, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 2(1) and (2) of the Control of Intoxicating Liquor (Designated Public Places) Ordinance, 2007, hereby orders:-

1. In order to prevent nuisance or annoyance to members of the public or a section of the public or disorder which is likely to be associated with the consumption of intoxicating liquor in that place, the area marked in red on the attached plan, that is:-
  - (a) The Castle Pier; and
  - (b) The entire area covered by the Bus Terminus and the South Esplanade from its junction with the Quayside to its junction with the Castle Pier and Ilavelet; and
  - (c) The Albert Pier for its entire area; and
  - (d) The entire area of Church Square, including Church Hill and the alleyway and steps leading from Church Square to the Commercial Arcade; and
  - (e) The whole of the Commercial Arcade; and
  - (f) Cornet Street from the junction with the South Esplanade up as far as the junction with Tower Hill and Cliff Street;
  - (g) Fountain Street from its junction with Church Hill to the Le Petit Carrefour and Market Street; and
  - (h) Le Petit Carrefour; and
  - (i) Market Street and Market Square from its junction with the Le Petit Carrefour to its junctions with Church Square and Church Hill; and
  - (j) Constitution Steps from its junction with Market Street to the junction with Clifton Stairs; and

- (k) The High Street from its junction with Le Pollet and Smith Street to its junction with Church Square; and
- (l) Smith Street from its junction with Le Pollet and the High Street to its junction to Rue du Manoir
- (m) The part of Lefebvre Street from its junction with Rue du Manoir; and
- (n) Le Pollet for its entire length from its junction with Le Truchot to its junction with High Street and Smith Street; and
- (o) La Plaiderie from its junction with Le Pollet to the Sir William Place; and
- (p) The Weighbridge taxi rank to the junction with Le Truchot to the west, the junction with Le Pollet to the south and the junction with St. Julian's Avenue to the north; and
- (q) The Weighbridge Roundabout; and
- (a) The North Esplanade, North Plantation, Le Tourgand, to its junction with Le Pollet, and the Quay to its junction with Church Hill; and
- (b) The Victoria Pier for its entire area, including the north and south arms of the Pier; and
- (c) North Pier Steps from the Quay to the High Street; and
- (d) Quay Steps from the Quay to North Pier Steps; and
- (e) Quay Street from its junction with the Quay to its junction with High Street; and
- (f) Cow Lane from its junction with the Quay to its junction with Church Square; and
- (g) The paved area to the seaward side of the Town Church to its junction with Church Hill to the south and its boundary with Church Square to its west; and
- (h) The two Venelles located between Quay Steps and Quay Street from their junction with Quay to the High Street; and

shall be a designated public place for the purpose of the Ordinance within the times specified below.

2. The area specified in 1. above, shall be a designated public place between 8.00am and 6.00pm on Sunday 15 July 2012

3. This Order may be cited as the Intoxicating Liquor (Designated Public Places) (Olympic Torch) Order 2012.
4. This Order shall come into force on the 15 July 2012.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This order sets out the areas that are to be designated as a Designated Public Place, that is, prohibiting the consumption of intoxicating liquor in the areas so specified during the times specified.


The Order shall not apply to:-

- (a) licensed premises within the meaning of the Liquor Licensing Ordinance 2006 ;
- (b) a place within the curtilage of such licensed premises;
- (c) a place which may be used for the supply of intoxicating liquor or which could have been so used within the last twenty minutes by virtue of an occasional liquor permit within the meaning of the Liquor Licensing Ordinance 2006; or
- (d) a place where facilities or activities relating to the sale of or consumption of intoxicating liquor are for the time being permitted by virtue of an *al fresco* licence granted under the Public Highways (Temporary Closure) Ordinance 1999.

Further, if a police officer reasonably believes that a person is, or has been, consuming intoxicating liquor in a designated public place or intends to consume intoxicating liquor in such a place the officer may require the person concerned:-

- (a) not to consume in that place anything which is, or which the police officer reasonably believes to be, intoxicating liquor;
- (b) to surrender anything in his possession which is, or which the police officer reasonably believes to be, intoxicating liquor or a container for such liquor.

However, a person is not required to surrender intoxicating liquor in a sealed container unless a police officer reasonably believes that the person concerned intends to consume the liquor in a designated public place.
