THE SOCIAL INSURANCE (MARINERS) (AMENDMENT)
(GUERNSEY) REGULATIONS, 1973

Made 27th March, 1973
Laid before the States
Coming into Operation 27th March, 1973

THE STATES INSURANCE AUTHORITY, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section sixty-four and section seventy-seven of the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1964, as amended, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

Amendment of regulation seven of the principal regulations.

1. In regulation seven of the Social Insurance (Mariners) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1964 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations") the words "six months", wherever they occur, are hereby repealed and the words "twelve months" are hereby substituted therefor.

Transitional provision.

2. The provisions of regulation seven of the principal regulations, as amended by these regulations, shall apply to any right to a sum by way of benefit accruing before the coming into operation of these regulations.

Citation, collective title and commencement.

3. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Social Insurance (Mariners) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1973.

(2) These regulations and the principal regulations may be cited together as the Social Insurance (Mariners) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1964 and 1973.

(3) These regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-seventh day of March, nineteen hundred and seventy-three.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport).

These Regulations are made in consequence of the Social Insurance (Claims and Payments) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1973, and amend the provisions of the Social Insurance (Mariners) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1964, relating to the extension, in the case of mariners, of the normal period after which, if payment has not been obtained, the right to benefit is extinguished under the Law.
