

WHEREAS by the Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1971, dated the 16th March, 1971, (a), the importation into Guernsey of goods consigned from a place outside the United Kingdom, the Island of Jersey, the other Islands of the Bailiwick of Guernsey or the Isle of Man is prohibited unless under the authority of a licence granted by or on behalf of the States Board of Administration:

NOW THEREFORE the States Board of Administration, in exercise of its powers under Article 2 of the above-mentioned Order, hereby authorises as follows:-

1. The Open General Import Licence made by the States Board of Administration and dated the thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and seventy one, (b), as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:-
  - (a) In Article 1 the heading "Origin - Fish, etc." and the related paragraph is deleted.
  - (b) For Article 4 there is substituted the following:-
    - "4. Subject to Article 6 hereof, goods comprised in any entry in the Second Schedule hereto may be imported into Guernsey under the authority of this Licence:-
      - (a) if they originate in Australia, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Denmark, Finland, France, the Federal Republic of Germany or Berlin (West), Iceland, the Republic of Ireland, Israel, Italy, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Portugal, Sweden, Switzerland or the United States of America and are consigned to Guernsey from any of those countries or territories; or
      - (b) if they originate in Japan and are consigned to Guernsey from Japan and are not goods which are also comprised in an entry in the First Schedule in relation to which the letter "J" appears against the entry; or
      - (c) if they are handloom fabrics, or articles made entirely or mainly of handloom fabrics, and a certificate in respect thereof by the Department of Trade and Industry under the provisions of Article 3 (1)(b) of the United Kingdom Import Duty Reliefs (No. 1) Order, 1972 is produced to the Chief Revenue Officer"
  - (c) For Article 5 there is substituted the following:-
    - "5. Subject to Articles 3 and 6 hereof, goods comprised in any entry in the Third Schedule hereto may be imported into Guernsey under the authority of this Licence if they originate in the following Area or in any of the following countries or territories:-
      - (a) the countries or territories set out in Article 4(a);
      - (b) Japan; or
      - (c) the Eastern Areaand are consigned to Guernsey from that Area or from any of those countries or territories,"
    - (d) In Article 6(1), after sub-paragraph (iv), there is added the following:-
      - "or;
      - (v) of whale products (other than sperm oil.)"

2. This Amendment shall take effect on the twenty fifth day of April nineteen hundred and seventy three and may be modified or revoked at any time by the States Board of Administration.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Amendment to the Open General Import Licence but is intended to indicate its general purport).

The main effects of this Amendment are:-

1. In future the Licence will not authorise the importation of certain textile goods (set out in the Amendment of the 12th December, 1972,) containing polyester fibres, originating in any country, territory or Area other than those set out in paragraph 1 (c) of this Amendment.
2. The restriction on the importation of certain textile goods (listed in the Second Schedule) which originated in (a) the Republic of Ireland unless consigned to Guernsey from that country, and (b) Portugal unless consigned to Guernsey from Portugal under the authority of the Government of that country, is now removed, and provided such goods originate in the Republic of Ireland or Portugal they may now be imported into Guernsey from any of the countries or territories listed in Article 4(a) of the Licence.
3. Whale products (other than sperm oil) are added to the goods which may not be imported from any source under the authority of the Licence.
4. Handloom cotton textiles may continue to be imported under the Licence if a certificate by the Department of Trade and Industry that they are imported in accordance with arrangements made between Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom and the government of a developing country is produced to the Chief Revenue Officer.
