The Social Insurance (Unemployment and Sickness Benefit) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1973

Made *5th September, 1973*
 Coming into Operation *10th September, 1973*

THE STATES INSURANCE AUTHORITY, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section twelve and section seventy-seven of the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1964, as amended, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

Amendment of regulation seven of the principal regulations.

1. Regulation seven of the Social Insurance (Unemployment and Sickness Benefit) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1964, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows, that is to say -

- (a) in paragraph (f) thereof, the words "forty shillings" are hereby repealed and the words "four pounds and fifty new pence" are hereby substituted therefor;
- (b) in paragraph (g) thereof, the words "thirty-three new pence" are hereby repealed and the words "seventy-five new pence" are hereby substituted therefor.

Citation and commencement.

2. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Social Insurance (Unemployment and Sickness Benefit) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1973, and these regulations and the Social Insurance (Unemployment and Sickness Benefit) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1964 to 1971, may be cited together as the Social Insurance (Unemployment and Sickness Benefit) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1964 to 1973.

(2) These regulations shall come into operation on the *tenth* day of *September*, nineteen hundred and seventy-three.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport).

These Regulations further amend regulation seven of the Social Insurance (Unemployment and Sickness Benefit) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1964, as amended, by increasing from two pounds a week to four pounds and fifty new pence a week the earnings limit for permitted work for sickness benefit purposes, and by increasing from thirty-three new pence a day to seventy-five new pence a day the unemployment benefit subsidiary occupation earnings limit.
