The Immigration (Work Permit Fee) (Guernsey) Order, 1972

Made 27th December, 1972.

Coming into Operation. 1st January, 1973

The States Board of Administration in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by section 33(1) of the Immigration Act, 1971, as extended to the Bailiwick of Guernsey by the Immigration (Guernsey) Order, 1972, hereby orders:-

1. The fee to be paid by an employer for a permit in writing issued to him for the engagement in his employment of a person who is not patrial in accordance with the provisions of sub-section one of section 33 of the Immigration Act, 1971, as extended to the Bailiwick of Guernsey by the Immigration (Guernsey) Order, 1972, shall be one pound sterling.

2. This Order shall come into force on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and seventy three.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order)

This Order specifies the fee to be paid by employers engaging in employment persons who are not patrial and except in so far as it relates to Commonwealth Citizens who are not patrial, corresponds to the provisions of paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of section four of the Aliens Restriction (Guernsey) Law, 1958, which will cease to have effect on the coming into force of the Immigration Act, 1971
