

THE FLOWER TRANSPORT ORDER, 1972

Made ..... 12th January, 1972

Coming into operation ..... 17th January, 1972

THE STATES COMMITTEE FOR HORTICULTURE, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section sixty-six of the Flower Transport Ordinance, 1971, hereby orders:-

1. A producer of non-edible horticultural produce who delivers or causes to be delivered any such produce to the Guernsey Flower Transport Authority in accordance with the provisions of Part VII of the Flower Transport Ordinance, 1971, for transport to the destination required by him shall so deliver that produce or cause it to be so delivered at the Hangar, situate at La Villiaze Airport in the Parish of the Forest, subject to the following conditions, that is to say:-

- (a) such produce shall be delivered as aforesaid only on Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday in any week either -
- (i) during the period commencing at eight o'clock in the forenoon on any of those days and ending at noon on the same day, or
  - (ii) during the period commencing at one o'clock in the afternoon of any of those days and ending at three o'clock in the afternoon on the same day;
- (b) such produce shall be delivered as aforesaid either in single boxes or in packages of two boxes parcelled together so, however, that each such package shall not exceed ten and one half inches in depth;
- (c) each consignment of such produce delivered as aforesaid shall be accompanied by a consignment note in such form as may, from time to time, be approved by the Authority and so completed as to furnish the particulars specified therein.

2. (1) In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:-

"consignment" means a consignment of non-edible horticultural produce all of which is consigned to the same consignee;  
"non-edible horticultural produce" means any horticultural produce which is not edible by human beings.

(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.

3. This Order may be cited as the Flower Transport Order, 1972.

4. This Order shall come into force on the seventeenth day of January, nineteen hundred and seventy-two.

NOTE

This Note is for information only and forms no part of the Order)

Under the provisions of subsection (3) of section seventy of the Flower Transport Ordinance, 1971, any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Order shall be guilty of an offence and liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding twenty-five pounds.
