

The Gambling (Public Lotteries)(No.3)(Amendment No.14) Order, 1972

Made 18th July, 1972.....

Coming into operation 18th July, 1972.....

THE STATES GAMBLING CONTROL COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by sections three, six, seven and eight of the Gambling (Public Lotteries) Ordinance, 1971(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf hereby orders:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Gambling (Public Lotteries)(No.3) Order, 1971(b), as amended (c), if in the snowball lottery to be drawn on the eighteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and seventy-two, any unsold serial number is drawn in respect of a major prize, the Presiding Officer shall -

- (a) declare the drawing of the unsold serial number to be null and void;
- (b) cause the tokens removed from the first four containers to be replaced in the containers from which they were removed;
- (c) cause another serial number to be drawn in place of the unsold serial number.

2. In this Order, the expression "unsold serial number" means, in relation to tickets of the series issued in respect of -

- (a) the ordinary lottery drawn on the sixth day of June, nineteen hundred and seventy-two, a serial number which exceeds the number thirty two thousand three hundred and forty nine;
- (b) the ordinary lottery drawn on the twentieth day of June, nineteen hundred and seventy-two, a serial number which exceeds the number thirty two thousand one hundred and ninety nine;

3. This Order may be cited as the Gambling (Public Lotteries)(No.3) (Amendment No.14) Order, 1972, and shall come into force on the eighteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and seventy-two.
