The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) (No. 5)
Regulations, 1972

Made the 24th day of October, 1972.

Coming into operation on the 27th day of October, 1972.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine (a), and the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950 (b), and of all powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island:-

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, drive or ride that vehicle or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along the unnamed road lying to the west of Sandy Hook, Saint Sampson, from its junction with Sandy Hook and Kimberley Avenue to its other junction with Sandy Hook, otherwise than from east to west and north to south.

2. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them:-

"animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine;

"Chief Officer" means the Chief Officer of the Island Police Force.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including these Regulations.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets)(No. 5) Regulations, 1972.

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the twenty-seventh day of October, nineteen hundred and seventy-two, and shall continue in force until the twenty-sixth day of April, nineteen hundred and seventy-three.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note forms no part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport)

The effect of these Regulations is that for a period of six months from the 27th October, 1972, the loop road adjoining the quarry at Sandy Hook, Saint Sampson, will be a one-way street, traffic being required to travel in an easterly and southerly direction from its junction with Sandy Hook and Kimberley Avenue.
