THE IMPORT AND EXPORT OF GOODS (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1971

AMENDMENT TO OPEN GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE

WHEREAS by the Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1971 dated the 16th March, 1971 (a), the importation into Guernsey of goods consigned from a place outside the United Kingdom, the Island of Jersey, the other Islands of the Bailiwick of Guernsey or the Isle of Man is prohibited unless under the authority of a licence granted by or on behalf of the States Board of Administration:

NOW THEREFORE the States Board of Administration, in exercise of its powers under Article 2 of the above-mentioned Order, hereby authorises as follows:-

1. The Open General Import Licence made by the States Board of Administration and dated the thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and seventy one, (b), as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:-

(a) In Articles 2, 3 and 4, for "Article 5" there shall be substituted "Article 6" and Article 5, as amended, shall be re-numbered "Article 6";

(b) In Article 2, for the words "either of the Schedules" there shall be substituted the words "any of the Schedules";

(c) In Article 3, for the proviso there shall be substituted the following:-

"Provided that nothing in this article shall operate to authorise the importation of any goods if the goods are comprised in an entry in the First Schedule and also in any entry in the Second or Third Schedules hereto";

(d) After Article 4 there shall be added the following further Article:-

"5. Subject to Articles 3 and 6 hereof, goods comprised in any entry in the Third Schedule hereto may be imported into Guernsey under the authority of this Licence unless they originate in Hong Kong, South Korea or Taiwan";

(e) The following entries in the First Schedule (and the related letter "E") shall be deleted, namely:-

"Sea fish, fresh (dead), chilled or frozen, other than

(i) fresh sea fish and fresh, chilled or frozen salmon, originating in and consigned from Poland; and

(ii) fresh, chilled or frozen sturgeon";

"Crustaceans and molluscs, whether in shell or not, fresh (live or dead), chilled, frozen, salted, in brine or dried, other than cockles, mussels, prawns, shrimps and winkles, fresh; crustaceans in shell simply boiled in water, other than prawns and shrimps not in airtight containers", and

"Crustaceans and molluscs, prepared or preserved";

(f) There shall be added after the Second Schedule the following:-

"THIRD SCHEDULE

Description of Goods

Woven fabrics containing cotton and polyester fibres the polyester content being 50% or more by weight of the textile fibres other than cotton.

Woven fabrics containing cotton and polyester fibres the polyester content being 50% or more by weight of the textile fibres other than cotton.

Woven pile fabrics and chenille fabrics of which the cotton content does not exceed 50% by weight and the polyester fibre content is 50% or more by weight of the textile fibres other than cotton.

Men's and boys' outer garments containing woven fabric of a mixture of cotton and polyester fibres, whether or not containing other textile fibres, of which the cotton content does not exceed 50% by weight of the garment and the polyester content is 50% or more by weight of the total textile fibre content of the garment excluding cotton.

Women's, girls' and infants' outer garments containing woven fabric of a mixture of cotton and polyester fibres, whether or not containing other textile fibres, of which the cotton content does not exceed 50% by weight of the garment and the polyester content is 50% or more by weight of the total textile fibre content of the garment excluding cotton.

Men's and boys' under garments containing woven fabric of a mixture of cotton and polyester fibres, whether or not containing other textile fibres, of which the cotton content does not exceed 50% by weight of the garment and the polyester content is 50% or more by weight of the total textile fibre content of the garment excluding cotton.

Women's, girls' and infants' under garments containing woven fabric of a mixture of cotton and polyester fibres, whether or not containing other textile fibres, of which the cotton content does not exceed 50% by weight of the garment and the polyester content is 50% or more by weight of the total textile fibre content of the garment excluding cotton.

Handkerchiefs containing woven fabric of a mixture of cotton and polyester fibres, whether or not containing other textile fibres, of which the cotton content does not exceed 50% by weight of the handkerchief and the polyester content is 50% or more by weight of the total textile fibre content of the handkerchief excluding cotton.

Shawls, scarves, mufflers, mantillas, veils and the like containing woven fabric of a mixture of cotton and polyester fibres, whether or not containing other textile fibres, of which the cotton content does not exceed 50% by weight of the article and the polyester content is 50% or more by weight of the total textile fibre content of the article excluding cotton.

Bed linen, table linen, toilet linen and kitchen linen containing woven fabric of a mixture of cotton and polyester fibres, whether or not containing other textile fibres, of which the cotton content does not exceed 50% by weight of the article and the polyester content is 50% or more by weight of the total textile fibre content of the article excluding cotton.

Other made-up textile articles (including dress patterns) containing woven fabric of a mixture of cotton and polyester fibres, whether or not containing other textile fibres, of which the cotton content does not exceed 50% by weight of the article and the polyester content is 50% or more by weight of the total textile fibre content of the article excluding cotton".

2. This Amendment shall take effect on the Fifteenth day of December nineteen hundred and seventy two and may be modified or revoked at any time by the States Board of Administration.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Amendment to the Open General Import Licence but is intended to indicate its general purport).

The main effects of this Amendment are that:-

1. In future the Licence will not authorise the importation of certain textile goods (mentioned in paragraph 1(f) of this Amendment) containing cotton and polyester fibres, originating in Hong Kong, South Korea or Taiwan.
2. Sea fish, and crustaceans and molluscs may now be imported under the Licence notwithstanding that they originate in, or are consigned from the Eastern Area.
