The Gambling (Public Lotteries) (No. 3) Amendment (No. 30) Order, 1972

THE STATES GAMBLING CONTROL COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by sections three, six, seven and eight of the Gambling (Public Lotteries) Ordinance, 1971 (a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf lawfully to act:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Gambling (Public Lotteries) (No. 3) Order, 1971 (b), as amended (c), if in the scratchball lottery to be drawn on the nineteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and seventy-two, any wrong serial number is drawn in respect of a major prize, the Presiding Officer shall -

- (a) declare the drawing of the unsold serial number to be null and void;
- (b) cause the tokens removed from the first four containers to be replaced in the containers from which they were removed;
- (c) cause another serial number to be drawn in place of the unsold serial number.

2. In this Order, the expression "unsold serial number" means, in relating to tickets of the series issued in respect of -

- (a) the ordinary lottery drawn on the twenty-sixth day of September nineteen hundred and seventy-two, a serial number which exceeds the number twenty-nine thousand eight hundred and nine;
- (b) the ordinary lottery drawn on the nineteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and seventy-two a serial number which exceeds the number twenty-nine thousand seven hundred and sixty-nine.

3. This Order may be cited as the Gambling (Public Lotteries) (No. 3) (Amendment No. 30) Order, 1972, and shall come into force on the nineteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and seventy-two.
