The Immigration (Landing and Embarkation Cards)(Guernsey)  
Order, 1972.

Made . . . . . 27th December, 1972

Coming into Operation . . . . . 1st January, 1973.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by paragraph 5 of Schedule 2 to the Immigration Act 1971, as extended to the Bailiwick of Guernsey by the Immigration (Guernsey) Order, 1972, I hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Immigration (Landing and Embarkation Cards (Guernsey) Order, 1972 and shall come into operation on 1st January, 1973.

2. -(1) In this Order-

"alien" has the same meaning as in the British Nationality Act, 1948;

"the Bailiwick" means the Bailiwick of Guernsey and the territorial waters adjacent thereto.

(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948 shall apply to the interpretation of this Order throughout the Bailiwick.

3. (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this Article, every alien of or over the age of 16 years who disembarks or embarks in the Bailiwick shall, if so required by an immigration officer, produce to that officer a landing or, as the case may be, an embarkation card in such form as may be directed by me; which shall be supplied for the purpose by the owners or agents of the ship or aircraft concerned.

(2) This Article shall not apply to any person landing or seeking to land from a ship coming from a place in the common travel area or from an aircraft coming from a place in the United Kingdom and Islands or embarking or seeking to embark on a ship or aircraft bound for a place in the common travel area, and shall not apply to a person landing or seeking to land from an aircraft coming from a place in the Republic of Ireland unless that person entered that Republic in

the course of a journey to the Bailiwick which began outside the common travel area and was not given leave to land in that Republic in accordance with the law in force there.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order)

This Order requires any alien (which term does not include a citizen of the Republic of Ireland) of or over the age of 16 years who disembarks or embarks in the Bailiwick (subject to the exceptions mentioned below) to produce, if so required, to an immigration officer, a landing or embarkation card in such form as the Lieutenant-Governor may direct and requires the owners or agents of the ship or aircraft concerned to supply such cards for this purpose. The Order replaces the provisions of section 6(1)(b) of the Aliens Restriction (Guernsey) Law, 1958, which ceases to have effect on the coming into force of the Immigration Act 1971. The Order does not apply to any person landing from a ship coming from the common travel area (that is to say the area comprising the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and Republic of Ireland) or from an aircraft coming from the United Kingdom or Islands nor to any person embarking on a ship or aircraft bound for a place in the common travel area. In relation to persons landing from an aircraft coming from the Republic of Ireland, it only applies to persons who entered the Republic in the course of a journey to the United Kingdom which began outside the common travel area and were not given leave to land in the Republic.
