The Immigration (Particulars of Passengers and Crew)  
(Guernsey) Order, 1972.

Made . . . . . 27th December, 1972.

Coming into Operation . . . . . 1st January, 1973

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by paragraph 27(2) of Schedule 2 of the Immigration Act, 1971, as extended to the Bailiwick of Guernsey by the Immigration (Guernsey) Order, 1972, I hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Immigration (Particulars of Passengers and Crew (Guernsey) Order, 1972 and shall come into operation on 1st January, 1973.
2. -(1) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948 shall apply to the interpretation of this Order throughout the Bailiwick.  
(2) In this Order the expression "Bailiwick" means the Bailiwick of Guernsey and the territorial waters adjacent thereto.
3. -(1) This Article applies to a ship which arrives in the Bailiwick from or after calling at a place outside the common travel area or an aircraft which arrives there from or after calling at a place outside the United Kingdom and Islands.  
(2) Subject to the following provisions of this Article, the captain of a ship or aircraft to which this Article applies shall:-
  - (a) if so required by an immigration officer, furnish to that officer, a list of names and nationalities of all passengers arriving on a ship or aircraft, as the case may be; and
  - (b) (i) in the case of a ship, furnish to an immigration officer within 12 hours of the arrival of the ship, a return in a form set out in the Schedule to this Order containing particulars of all members of the crew arriving on the ship;

- (ii) in the case of an aircraft, if so required by an immigration officer, furnish to that officer a list of the names, dates of birth and nationalities of all members of the crew arriving on the aircraft as soon as practicable after the arrival of the aircraft.
- (3) In relation to an aircraft which started its flight in the Republic of Ireland, paragraph (2) of this Article shall have effect as if-
    - (a) for the reference in sub-paragraph (a) to all passengers arriving on the aircraft there were substituted a reference to any passengers so arriving (not being citizens of that Republic) who entered that Republic in the course of a journey to the Bailiwick which began outside the common travel area and were not given leave to land in that Republic in accordance with the law in force there; and
    - (b) sub-paragraph (b)(ii) were omitted.
  - (4) An immigration officer may by notice given to the captain of a ship or aircraft dispense with the requirements of paragraph (2)(b) of this Article either in respect of all members of the crew or in respect of such classes of persons as he may specify.
  - (5) Any passenger on a ship or aircraft shall furnish to the captain of the ship or aircraft, as the case may be, any information required by him for the purpose of complying with the provisions of this Article.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order)

This Order makes provision for requiring captains of ships and aircraft arriving in the Bailiwick from or after calling at a place outside the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or (except in relation to aircraft) the Republic of Ireland to furnish particulars of members of the crew and the names and nationalities of passengers arriving on the ship or aircraft to an immigration officer and enables the immigration officer to dispense with the obligation to furnish particulars of the crew in respect of some or all of the members. The Order contains provisions corresponding to those contained in Section 9 of the Aliens Restriction (Guernsey) Law, 1958, which ceases to have effect on the coming into force of the Immigration Act 1971.
