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The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying)  
(Guernsey) Regulations, 1971

THE STATES BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by paragraph (1) of Article 57 of the Air Navigation Order, 1960 (a), as amended and applied to Guernsey by the Air Navigation (Guernsey) Order, 1966 (b), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:-

- 1. (1) An aircraft shall not fly at a height of less than 2,000 feet above ground level over the area bounded by a circle of three nautical miles radius having its centre at the premises known as "Clos de Dixcart" in the Island of Sark:  
Provided that nothing in this regulation shall prohibit flight over the said area at a height of less than 2,000 feet above ground level in conformity with permission granted by or on behalf of the States Board of Administration.
- (2) For the purpose of this regulation, the position of the said Clos de Dixcart shall be deemed to be 49° 25' 50" N., 02° 21' 40" W.

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1971, and shall come into force on the twenty-third day of February, nineteen hundred and seventy-one.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations restrict the height at which aircraft may fly over the Island of Sark without the permission of the States Board of Administration
