

THE IMPORT AND EXPORT OF GOODS (CONTROL)(GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1971

AMENDMENT TO OPEN GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE

WHEREAS by the Import and Export of Goods (Control)(Guernsey) Order, 1971, dated the 16th March, 1971 (a) the importation into Guernsey of goods consigned from a place outside the United Kingdom, the Island of Jersey, the other Islands of the Bailiwick of Guernsey or the Isle of Man is prohibited unless under the authority of a licence granted by or on behalf of the States Board of Administration

NOW THEREFORE, the States Board of Administration, in exercise of its powers under Article 2 of the above-mentioned Order, hereby authorises as follows:-

1. The Open General Import Licence made by the States Board of Administration and dated the twenty-first day of February, nineteen hundred and sixty seven, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:-
  - (a) In Schedule 1 thereof for the entry relating to "sugar of a polarisation exceeding 98 degrees" is hereby deleted and the following entry is hereby substituted therefor:

"S .... Beet sugar and cane sugar, solid

S .... Sucrose sugar, solid, which can be completely tested by the polariscope, whether or not flavoured or coloured

S .... Invert sugar and syrups containing sucrose, whether or not flavoured or coloured."
  - (b) In Schedule 1 thereof the following entries are hereby deleted:
    - (i) "S .... Gold medals, medallions, tablets and other such pieces in pictorial relief or bearing inscriptions, other than those weighing not more than five penny-weights and of a value not exceeding £2. 10. 0.
    - (ii) S .... Gold coins."
  - (c) In Group 1 of the Second Schedule thereto the entry relating to "sugar of a polarization not exceeding 98 degrees, invert sugar, molasses, syrups and other forms of liquid sugar" is hereby deleted and the following entry is hereby substituted therefor:-

"Molasses"
  - (d) In Group 1 of the Second Schedule thereto after the entry relating to "Vegetables, the following" the following entry is hereby added:-

"Fresh, the following:-

Dry-bulb onions and shallots, if imported after the last day of February but before the first of August in any one year; and, Tomatoes, if imported after the thirty first of October in any year and before the first of April in the following year."

- (e) In Group 2 of the Second Schedule thereto, in the entry relating to "gold medals, medallions, tablets and other such pieces in pictorial relief or bearing inscriptions", the words "weighing not more than five pennyweights and of a value not exceeding £2. 10. 0." are hereby deleted.
- (f) In Group 2 of the Second Schedule thereto to the entry "Gold bullion" there is hereby added the words "and gold coins".

2. This Amendment shall take effect on the twelfth day of May, nineteen hundred and seventy one and may be modified or revoked at any time by the States Board of Administration.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Amendment to the Open General Import Licence but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

The main effect of this Amendment is that:-

- (1) Individual licences are now required for the import from any source of most kinds of sugar and syrups containing sucrose.
- (2) Fresh tomatoes and dry-bulb onions and shallots originating in or consigned from the Eastern Area may be imported under the licence during the periods specified.
- (3) All gold medals, medallions, tablets and other such pieces in pictorial relief or bearing inscriptions irrespective of weight or value and gold coins may now be imported from any source other than Southern Rhodesia without individual licences.
