THE EXPORT OF PRODUCE (OTHER THAN TOMATOES) ORDER, 1971

THE STATES COMMITTEE FOR HORTICULTURE, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section seven and subsection (1) of section seven A of the Export of Produce (Other than Tomatoes) (Packing and Grading) Ordinance, 1956, as amended (a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

1. For the purposes of paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section seven and of subsection (1) of section seven A of the Export of Produce (Other than Tomatoes) (Packing and Grading) Ordinance, 1956, as amended (a), containers for the export of flowers, fern and other foliage shall be of the types and sizes set out in the First Schedule to this Order.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section one of this Order containers of the types and sizes set out in the Second Schedule to this Order may be used for the export of flowers of the descriptions specified in that Schedule.

3. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.

4. The Export of Produce (Other than Tomatoes) Order, 1967(b), is hereby repealed.

5. This Order may be cited as the Export of Produce (Other than Tomatoes) Order, 1971.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of **June**, nineteen hundred and seventy-one.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport)

This Order which repeals the Export of Produce (Other than Tomatoes), Order, 1967, prescribes the types and sizes of the containers to be used for the export of flowers, fern and other foliage from this Island with effect from the 1st June, 1971. The main purpose of the Order is to standardize the depth of containers at $5\frac{1}{2}$ inches and $10\frac{1}{2}$ inches to facilitate the unitization of consignments. Special sizes of containers are prescribed for flowers with exceptionally long stems and for chrysanthemums with blooms too large for packing in containers with a depth of $5\frac{1}{4}$ inches.
