

The Gambling (Public Lotteries) Order, 1971

THE STATES GAMBLING CONTROL COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by sections three, five, six, seven and eight of the Gambling (Public Lotteries) Ordinance, 1971(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf hereby orders:-

INTERPRETATION

1.(1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, "apparatus" means the apparatus described in paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section four of this Order;

"container" means a container forming part of the apparatus;

"the Ordinance" means the Gambling (Public Lotteries) Ordinance, 1971;

"presiding officer" means the person appointed or chosen as such in accordance with the provisions of section six of the Ordinance;

"series" means all tickets issued in respect of any one ordinary lottery and "selected series" means a series selected by the procedure set out in subsection (1) of section six of this Order;

"tumbled" means moved and stirred by operation of the apparatus;

and any other expressions have the same meaning as in the Ordinance.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in this Order to any other enactment or order shall be construed as including a reference to that enactment or that order, as the case may be, as amended, extended, repealed, replaced or revoked by or under any other enactment or by or under any other order.

(3) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948(b), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.

TICKETS IN PUBLIC LOTTERIES

2.(1) In each ordinary lottery held in pursuance of section one of the Ordinance there shall be issued the number of tickets set out in the second column of the First Schedule to this Order opposite to the relevant date specified in the first column thereof.

(2) Subject to the provisions of subsection (3) of this section, the price at which a ticket shall be sold and bought shall be 50p.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (2) of this section, the amount to be charged on a sale by the Committee to an agent of the number of tickets allotted to him in pursuance of paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of section five of the Ordinance shall be the amount ascertained by multiplying the number of tickets so allotted to the agent by the price prescribed in subsection (2) of this section less a discount at the rate of ten per centum of the amount so ascertained.

PRIZES IN PUBLIC LOTTERIES

3. In each ordinary lottery held in pursuance of section one of the Ordinance there shall be payable the prizes specified in the Second Schedule to this Order for that lottery and in each snowball lottery so held there shall be payable the prizes specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order for that lottery.

ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS FOR DRAWS

4.(1) For the purpose of conducting draws, the Committee shall provide -

- (a) a sufficient staff to ensure the effective conduct of the draws;
- (b) an apparatus consisting of five containers numbered consecutively from 1 to 5 (hereinafter referred to respectively as "the first container", "the second container", "the third container", "the fourth container" and "the fifth container") and so constructed that their contents may be tumbled electrically or mechanically, each such container being provided with a means by which tokens may be removed singly;
- (c) all such other equipment as may be necessary for
 - (i) the effective conduct of the draw;
 - (ii) the verification and recording of serial numbers and of prizes drawn;
 - (iii) the public announcement of such serial numbers and prizes.

(2) Immediately before the time appointed for the draw, the presiding officer shall examine the apparatus and shall satisfy himself that the apparatus, together with the equipment provided in pursuance of paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of this section, is in proper working order, and he may invite any members of the public then present to examine the apparatus.

MANNER OF CONDUCTING DRAWS IN ORDINARY LOTTERIES

5.(1) At the time appointed for the draw in an ordinary lottery or as soon as may be thereafter, the presiding officer shall -

- (a) for the purpose of drawing the serial numbers of the winning tickets, cause to be placed -

- (i) in the first container, the number of tokens set out opposite to the relevant date in the third column of the First Schedule to this Order, being tokens numbered consecutively as set out opposite thereto in the fourth column thereof, indicating the thousands in such serial numbers;
 - (ii) in each of the second, third and fourth containers ten tokens numbered consecutively from 0 to 9, indicating respectively the hundreds, tens and units in such serial numbers;
- (b) for the purpose of drawing the prizes specified in the first paragraph of the Second Schedule to this Order, cause to be placed in the fifth container the tokens set out opposite to the relevant date in the fifth column of the First Schedule thereto, being tokens each bearing a mark indicating the prize to which it relates.

(2) Subject to the provisions of section seven of this Order, the drawing of the serial numbers, and of the prizes specified in the first paragraph of the Second Schedule to this Order shall be effected in the manner following, that is to say, the presiding officer -

- (a) shall cause the contents of all five of the containers to be thoroughly tumbled;
- (b) thereafter, shall cause one token to be removed from each of the first four containers in order and shall cause one token to be removed from the fifth container;

Provided that if a serial number already drawn in respect of a major prize is drawn in respect of a second or subsequent major prize in the same draw, he shall not cause a token to be removed from the fifth container, and, in such a case, he shall follow the procedure specified in section seven of this Order;

- (c) shall cause -
 - (i) the serial number and the prize so drawn to be verified and recorded, and thereafter publicly announced;
 - (ii) the tokens removed from the first four containers to be replaced in the containers from which they were removed;
 - (iii) the token removed from the fifth container to be put aside;

and the procedure set out in this subsection shall be repeated until the tokens in the fifth container have all been drawn.

(3) Subject to the provisions of section seven of this Order, the drawing of the serial numbers in respect of the prizes specified in the second paragraph of the Second Schedule to this Order shall be effected in the manner following, that is to say, the presiding officer -

- (a) shall ensure that the contents of the first four containers are as set out in paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of this section;
- (b) shall cause the contents of the first four containers to be thoroughly tumbled;
- (c) thereafter, shall cause one token to be removed from each of the first four containers in order;
- (d) shall cause the serial number so drawn to be verified and recorded and thereafter publicly announced;
- (e) shall cause the tokens removed from the first four containers to be replaced in the containers from which they were removed;
- (f) shall cause the processes set out in paragraphs (b), (c) and (d) of this subsection to be performed for a second time.

MANNER OF CONDUCTING DRAWS IN SNOWBALL LOTTERIES

6.(1) Before the drawing of the serial number of each winning ticket in a snowball lottery, the series from which such serial number shall be drawn shall be selected in the manner following, that is to say, the presiding officer shall -

- (a) cause to be placed in the fifth container the number of tokens set out opposite to the relevant date in the second column of the Third Schedule to this Order, being tokens corresponding in colour to the distinguishing colour of the tickets issued in the series which such tokens represent;
- (b) cause the contents of the fifth container to be thoroughly tumbled;
- (c) thereafter, cause one token to be removed from the fifth container;
- (d) cause the series so selected to be verified and recorded and thereafter publicly announced.

(2) For the purpose of drawing the serial numbers of the winning tickets, the presiding officer shall cause to be placed in each of the first four containers tokens of the same number and description as the tokens placed in such containers in respect of the draw previously held in the ordinary lottery for which tickets of the selected series were issued.

(3) Subject to the provisions of section seven of this Order, the drawing of the serial numbers in respect of the prizes specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order shall be effected in the manner following, that is to say, the presiding officer shall -

- (a) cause the contents of the first four containers to be thoroughly tumbled;
- (b) thereafter, cause one token to be removed from each of the first four containers in order;
- (c)(i) cause the serial number so drawn to be verified and recorded and thereafter publicly announced;

- (ii) cause the tokens removed from the first four containers to be replaced in the containers from which they were removed;

and shall cause the procedure set out in this section to be performed once in respect of each of the prizes specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order.

(4) Subject to the provisions of section seven of this Order -

- (a) the ticket of the selected series whose serial number corresponds to the serial number first drawn in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this section shall be the winning ticket in respect of the prize specified in paragraph (a) of the Fourth Schedule to this Order;
- (b) the tickets of the selected series whose serial numbers correspond to the six serial numbers next so drawn shall be the winning tickets in respect of the prizes specified in paragraph (b) of the Fourth Schedule to this Order.

DRAWING OF CERTAIN SERIAL NUMBERS TO BE NULL AND VOID

7.(1) Where, in a draw in a public lottery, the same serial number is drawn more than once in respect of a major prize, the presiding officer shall -

- (a) pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (c) of subsection (6) of section six of the Ordinance, declare the second and any subsequent such drawing of that serial number to be null and void;
- (b) cause the tokens removed from the first four containers to be replaced in the containers from which they were removed;
- (c) cause another serial number to be drawn in place of the first mentioned serial number.

(2) Where, in a draw in an ordinary lottery, the last three digits of the serial number drawn in pursuance of the provisions of paragraph (f) of subsection (3) of section five of this Order correspond to the last three digits of the serial number drawn in pursuance of the provisions of paragraph (c) of the said subsection, the presiding officer shall -

- (a) declare the drawing of the first mentioned serial number to be null and void;
- (b) cause the tokens removed from the first four containers to be replaced in the containers from which they were removed;
- (c) cause another serial number to be drawn in place of the first mentioned serial number.

(3) Where, in a draw in a snowball lottery, a serial number is drawn which is the serial number of a ticket returned by an agent pursuant to the provisions of an order made under paragraph (g) of subsection (3) of section five of the Ordinance, the presiding officer shall -

- (a) declare the drawing of the first mentioned serial number to be null and void;
- (b) cause the tokens removed from the first four containers to be replaced in the containers from which they were removed;
- (c) cause another serial number to be drawn in place of the first mentioned serial number.

AGENTS FOR THE SALE OF TICKETS

8. In addition to the conditions set out in subsection (3) of section five of the Ordinance, the following condition shall apply to every appointment of a person as an agent under subsection (1) of the said section five, and the acceptance by a person of such appointment shall be deemed to include the acceptance by him of that condition, that is to say, where, by reason of circumstances beyond its control, the Committee is prevented from delivering to an agent the number of tickets agreed by him in writing with the Committee, pursuant to the provisions of the said subsection (3), in respect of a public lottery, it shall be a sufficient compliance with the terms of such agreement if the Committee delivers to the agent a lesser number of tickets so however that in any such case the Committee shall, where circumstances permit, reduce proportionately the number of tickets delivered to all other agents in respect of that lottery.

CITATION AND COMMENCEMENT

9. This Order may be cited as the Gambling (Public Lotteries) Order, 1971, and shall come into force on the Twenty Sixth day of May, nineteen hundred and seventy one.

SECOND SCHEDULE Sections three and five
PRIZES FOR ORDINARY LOTTERIES

1. In each ordinary lottery, the prize to be paid in respect of a winning ticket the serial number of which is drawn shall be the prize hereinafter specified in relation to the token drawn in connection with such winning ticket, that is to say -
 - (a) one prize of three thousand pounds in relation to the token marked with the figure "1";
 - (b) one prize of one thousand pounds in relation to the token marked with the figure "2";
 - (c) one prize of five hundred pounds in relation to the token marked with the figure "3";
 - (d) one prize of two hundred and fifty pounds in relation to the token marked with the figure "4";
 - (e) one prize of one hundred pounds in relation to each of the tokens marked with the figure "100";
 - (f) one prize of fifty pounds in relation to each of the tokens marked with the figure "50";

2. In each ordinary lottery, the prize to be paid in respect of a winning ticket of which the last three digits of the serial number correspond to the last three digits of either of the serial numbers drawn pursuant to the provisions of subsection (3) of section five of this Order shall be twenty five pounds.

FOURTH SCHEDULE Sections three and six
PRIZES FOR SNOWBALL LOTTERIES

In each snowball lottery, the prize to be paid in respect of a winning ticket of the selected series the serial number of which is drawn shall be the prize hereinafter specified in connection with such winning ticket, that is to say -

- (a) in respect of the winning ticket the serial number of which is first drawn, a prize of not less than seven thousand five hundred pounds;
- (b) in respect of each of the six winning tickets the serial numbers of which are next drawn, a prize of not less than seventy-five pounds.
