(Guernsey) Regulations, 1971

THE STATES INSURANCE AUTHORITY, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section twenty A and section seventy-seven of the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1964, as amended, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-  
Interpretation.

1.(1) In these regulations, except where the context otherwise requires, "the Law" means the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1964, and any other expressions have the same meanings as in the Law.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these regulations to any enactment or regulations shall be construed as including a reference to that enactment or those regulations, as the case may be, as amended, repealed, replaced or revoked by or under any other enactment or by any other regulations.

(3) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall apply to the interpretation of these regulations as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.

Minimum weekly rate of contributions for child's special allowance.

2. For the purposes of paragraph (c) of section 20A of the Law (which paragraph provides that child's special allowance shall be payable if the husband referred to in that paragraph had before his death been contributing at not less than the prescribed weekly rate to the cost of providing for the child in question) the prescribed weekly rate shall be the weekly rate of the allowance payable in respect of the child as set out in columns (2) or (4), as appropriate, of item 8 of the Second Schedule to the Law.

Voidable marriages.

3. For the purpose of section 20A of the Law (which section provides for the payment of child's special allowance where a woman's marriage has been terminated by divorce) a voidable marriage which has been annulled, whether before or after the date when these regulations come into force, shall be treated as if it had been a valid marriage which was terminated by divorce at the date of the annulment.

Citation and commencement.

4. These regulations may be cited as the Social Insurance (Child's Special Allowance) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1971, and shall come into operation on the seventh day of June, nineteen hundred and seventy-one.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport).

These Regulations prescribes for the purposes of section 20A (c) of the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1964, as amended, the weekly sum which a husband must have been contributing before his death to the support of a child, so as to enable a woman, whose marriage has been terminated by divorce, to be entitled to child's special allowance.
