THE SOCIAL INSURANCE (UNEMPLOYMENT AND SICKNESS BENEFIT)
(AMENDMENT) (NO. 3) (GUERNSEY) REGULATIONS, 1971.

Made.....16th December, 1971

Coming into Operation.....20th December, 1971

THE STATES INSURANCE AUTHORITY, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section twelve and section seventy-seven of the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1964, as amended, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

Amendment to regulation three of the principal regulations.

1. (1) Paragraph (2) and paragraph (3) of regulation three of the Social Insurance (Unemployment and Sickness Benefit) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1964 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations") are hereby repealed and the following paragraph is hereby substituted therefor -

"(2) Where for the purposes of the provisions of the Social Insurance (Medical Certification) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1968, it has been certified that it is to be expected that a woman will be confined, she shall be deemed to be incapable of work on each day in the period between the beginning of the sixth week before the expected week of confinement and ending two weeks after the date of the confinement:

Provided that -

- (a) a woman shall not be deemed to be incapable of work by virtue of this paragraph on any day before the twentieth day of December, nineteen hundred and seventy-one;
- (b) this paragraph shall not apply to a woman in respect of any week in the said period during the whole or any part of which she does not abstain from work."

(2) Notwithstanding the repeal of paragraph (2) and paragraph (3) of regulation three of the principal regulations under the foregoing provisions of this regulation, any day which is not deemed to be a day of incapacity for work under the principal regulations as amended by these regulations shall nevertheless be deemed to be a day of incapacity for work if it would have been so deemed but for the repeal of the said paragraphs.

Amendment to regulation four of the Social Insurance (Unemployment and Sickness Benefit) (Amendment) (No. 2) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1971.

2. In paragraph (1) of regulation four of the Social Insurance (Unemployment and Sickness Benefit) (Amendment) (No. 2) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1971, for the comma immediately after the figures "1971", where those figures first occur, there is hereby substituted a full-stop and the words and figures from and including the words "and these regulations" to the end of that paragraph are hereby repealed.

Citation, collective title and commencement.

3. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Social Insurance (Unemployment and Sickness Benefit) (Amendment) (No. 3) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1971.

(2) These regulations and the Social Insurance (Unemployment and Sickness Benefit) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1964 and 1966, the Social Insurance (Unemployment and Sickness Benefit) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1971, and the Social Insurance (Unemployment and Sickness Benefit) (Amendment) (No. 2) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1971, may be cited together as the Social Insurance (Unemployment and Sickness Benefit) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1964 to 1971.

(3) These regulations shall come into operation on the twentieth day of December, nineteen hundred and seventy-one.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport).

These Regulations provide that a woman in respect of whom a medical certificate of expected confinement has been issued shall, for the purpose of making a claim for sickness benefit, be deemed to be incapable of work on each day in the period between the beginning of the sixth week before the expected week of confinement and ending two weeks after the date of confinement.
