

IMPORT AND EXPORT (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) LAW, 1946

THE IMPORT AND EXPORT OF GOODS (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1971

OPEN GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE

WHEREAS by the Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1971, dated the 16th March, 1971, (a), the importation into Guernsey of goods consigned from a place outside the United Kingdom, the Island of Jersey, the other Islands of the Bailiwick of Guernsey or the Isle of Man is prohibited unless under the authority of a licence granted by or on behalf of the States Board of Administration:

NOW THEREFORE, the Board of Administration, in exercise of its powers under Article 2 of the above-mentioned Order, hereby revokes the Open General Import Licence dated the 21st day of February, 1967 and the Amendments thereto, and grants the following Open General Import Licence:-

Interpretation

1. For the purposes of this Licence:-

Areas

"Dollar Area" means Bolivia, Canada, Colombia; Costa Rica, Cuba, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, the Republic of Honduras, Liberia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, the Phillipines, the United States of America and Venezuela;

"Eastern Area" means Albania, Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, Eastern Germany (U.S.S.R. zone and sector of Berlin), Hungary, North Korea, North Vietnam, the People's Republic of China, the People's Republic of Mongolia, Poland, Romania and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics; and

"Scheduled Territories" means the countries and territories which are for the time being the scheduled territories as defined in the Exchange Control Act 1947, as extended to the Channel Islands by the Exchange Control (Channel Islands) Order, 1947, together with the Sultanate of Oman.

Consignment - Lourenco Marques and Beira

Goods consigned to Guernsey from Lourenco Marques or Beira and originating in Malawi, Zambia or Botswana and goods consigned to Guernsey from Lourenco Marques and originating in the Republic of South Africa or Swaziland shall be regarded as consigned from the Scheduled Territories; and

Origin - Fish, etc.

Fish, whales and other natural produce of the sea taken at sea and goods produced or manufactured therefrom at sea shall be regarded as originating in the country or territory to which the ship by which they were taken or in which they were produced or manufactured belongs, and if brought direct to Guernsey, as consigned from that country or territory; and a registered ship shall, for the purposes of this paragraph, be deemed to belong to the country or territory in which it is registered.

2. Subject to Article 5 hereof, goods not comprised in any entry in either of the Schedules hereto may be imported into Guernsey under the authority of this Licence.
3. Subject to Article 5 hereof, goods comprised in any entry in the First Schedule hereto may be imported into Guernsey under the authority of this Licence unless they are:-

- (i) goods comprised in an entry in relation to which the letter 'W' appears in that Schedule;
- (ii) goods originating, or consigned to Guernsey from, the Dollar Area and comprised in an entry in that Schedule in relation to which the letter 'D' so appears;
- (iii) goods originating in, or consigned to Guernsey from, the Eastern Area and comprised in an entry in that Schedule in relation to which the letter 'E' so appears;
- (iv) goods originating in Japan and consigned to Guernsey otherwise than from Japan or goods consigned from Japan but otherwise than under the authority of the Government of Japan, and (in either case) comprised in an entry in that Schedule in relation to which the letter 'J' so appears;
- (v) goods originating in, or consigned to Guernsey from, Romania and comprised in an entry in that Schedule in relation to which the letters 'RO' so appear;
- (vi) goods originating in, or consigned to Guernsey from, a country or territory which is not one of the Scheduled Territories and comprised in an entry in that Schedule in relation to which the letters 'NST' so appear:

PROVIDED that nothing in this article shall operate to authorise the importation of any goods if the goods are comprised both in an entry in the First Schedule and an entry in the Second Schedule hereto.

4. Subject to Article 5 hereof, goods comprised in any entry in the Second Schedule hereto may be imported into Guernsey under the authority of this Licence:-

- (a) if they originate in Australia, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Denmark, Finland, France, the Federal Republic of Germany or the British, French or United States sector of Berlin, Iceland, Italy, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Sweden, Switzerland or the United States of America and are consigned to Guernsey from any of those countries or sectors; or
- (b) if they originate in the Irish Republic and are consigned to Guernsey from that country; or
- (c) if they originate in Portugal and are consigned to Guernsey from Portugal under the authority of the government of that country; or
- (d) if they originate in Japan and are consigned to Guernsey from Japan and are not goods which are also comprised in an entry in the First Schedule in relation to which the letter 'J' appears in that Schedule; or
- (e) if they are handloom products and originate in and are consigned to Guernsey from India.

Exceptions, etc.

5. (1) Nothing in this Licence shall authorise the importation:-

- (ii) of ferro-chromium that has been manufactured or processed from, or partly from, or contains, goods exported from Southern Rhodesia in contravention of any order made under the Southern Rhodesia Act 1965; or
- (iii) of plumage or articles consisting wholly or partly of plumage except where a written declaration is delivered to the proper officer of Customs containing a statement specifying the descriptions of birds from which the plumage was obtained and the plumage or the plumage content is plumage only of birds ordinarily used in Guernsey as articles of diet or birds of one or more of the following species:-

- (2) In this Article, 'plumage' includes skins or other parts of birds with feathers.

This Licence shall come into operation on the first day of December, nineteen hundred and seventy-one.

FIRST SCHEDULE

Description of Goods

- W Animals and other mammals.
- W Animal and poultry excrement
- W Caravans
- E Pig meat and edible pig meat offals, fresh, chilled or frozen.
- E Dead poultry and edible offals thereof, fresh, chilled or frozen.
- E Poultry liver, fresh, chilled, frozen, salted or in brine.
- NST Hams, whole, not in airtight containers.
- E Pig meat and poultry and edible offals thereof, salted, in brine, dried or smoked, other than hams, whole, not in airtight containers.
- E Sea fish, fresh (dead), chilled or frozen, other than
- (i) fresh seafish and fresh, chilled or frozen salmon, originating in and consigned from Poland; and
 - (ii) fresh, chilled or frozen sturgeon.
- E Crustaceans and molluscs, whether in shell or not, fresh (live or dead), chilled, frozen, salted, in brine or dried, other than cockles, mussels, prawns, shrimps and winkles, fresh; crustaceans in shell, simply boiled in water, other than prawns and shrimps not in airtight containers.
- NST Milk, fresh, not concentrated or sweetened
- E Cream, fresh, not concentrated or sweetened
- E Cream, preserved, concentrated or sweetened
- NST Milk, preserved, concentrated or sweetened, containing less than 50% by weight of butter fat.
- W Milk, preserved, concentrated or sweetened, containing 50% or more by weight of butter fat.

- W Potatoes, fresh or chilled, whether or not peeled or cut, other than new potatoes, being potatoes which have been dug when immature for marketing without delay, the skins of which can be removed by rubbing with the fingers or show evidence of natural skinning at the time of importation, and which are imported during the period from 1st November of any one year to 31st August of the next.
- E Vegetables, preserved by freezing, the following:
 - asparagus, green beans, beetroot, broccoli and cauliflowers, brussels sprouts, carrots, celery, cucumbers (other than gherkins), herbs, lettuce and endive, mushrooms, dry-bulb onions and shallots, green peas, potatoes, radishes, rhubarb, spinach, and turnips
- E Vegetables, provisionally preserved, consisting of or containing cauliflowers or onions.
- E Vegetables, dried, the following:
 - asparagus, green beans, beetroot, broccoli and cauliflowers, brussels sprouts, carrots, celery cucumbers (other than gherkins), herbs (other than in bulk), lettuce and endive, mushrooms, dry-bulb onions and shallots, potatoes, radishes, rhubarb, spinach, and turnips.
- D Bananas
- D Grapefruit, fresh
- NST ... Apples and pears, fresh
- E Cherries and plums, fresh
- E Currants, gooseberries, loganberries, raspberries, and strawberries, fresh
- E Fruit, preserved by freezing, the following:
 - apples, cherries, currants, gooseberries, loganberries, pears, plums, raspberries, and strawberries.
- D Grapefruit (whether or not cooked), preserved by freezing, not containing added sugar.
- E Fruit provisionally preserved, the following:
 - apples, cherries, currants, gooseberries, loganberries, pears, plums, raspberries, and strawberries
- E Fruit, dried, the following:
 - apples, cherries, currants, gooseberries, loganberries, pears, plums, raspberries, and strawberries.
- W Coffee, whether or not roasted or freed of caffeine; coffee substitutes containing coffee in any proportion.
- E Flour and meal of potato
- W Clover and grass seed.

- E Basil, borage, mint (excluding dried peppermint and pennyroyal), rosemary and sage, other than dried, in bulk.
- W Animal oils, modified, containing 50% or more by weight of butter fat (including hydrogenated butter fat and other chemically or physically modified butter fat).
- W Animal oils and fats (wholly or partly hydrogenated or solidified or hardened) containing 50% or more by weight of butter fat (including hydrogenated butter fat and other chemically or physically modified butter fat).
- W Margarine, imitation lard and other prepared edible fats containing 50% or more by weight of butter fat (including hydrogenated butter fat and other chemically or physically modified butter fat).
- E Sausages and the like, of pig or poultry products.
- NST ... Hams, whole, not in airtight containers.
- E Other prepared or preserved pig or poultry products, other than hams, whole, not in airtight containers.
- E Crustaceans and molluscs, prepared or preserved.
- W Beet sugar and cane sugar, solid.
- W Other sucrose sugar, solid, which can be completely tested by the polariscope; invert sugar and syrups containing sucrose.
- E Lactose
- W Sucrose sugar, solid, flavoured or coloured, which can be completely tested by the polariscope; invert sugar and syrups, flavoured or coloured, containing sucrose.
- E Lactose, flavoured or coloured.
- W Food preparations containing cocoa and 50% or more by weight of butter fat (including hydrogenated butter fat and other chemically or physically modified butter fat).
- E Vegetables prepared or preserved by vinegar or acetic acid, consisting of or containing beetroot, cauliflowers or onions.
- E Vegetables prepared or preserved otherwise than by vinegar or acetic acid, the following:
asparagus, green beans, beetroot, broccoli and cauliflowers, brussels sprouts, carrots, celery, cucumbers (other than gherkins), herbs, lettuce and endive, mushrooms, dry-bulb onions and shallots, green peas, potatoes, radishes, rhubarb, spinach, and turnips.
- E Fruit preserved by freezing, containing added sugar, the following:

- E Jams, fruit jellies, fruit puree and fruit pastes, derived from apples, cherries, currants, gooseberries, loganberries, pears, plums, raspberries or strawberries.
- E Fruit, otherwise prepared or preserved, the following: apples, cherries, currants, gooseberries, loganberries, pears, plums, raspberries, and strawberries.
- D Grapefruit, otherwise prepared or preserved, whether or not containing added sugar or spirit.
- W Grapefruit not grown in the country or territory from which it is consigned and mixtures of fruit containing such grapefruit, bottled or canned.
- E Fruit juices and syrups, derived from apples, blackcurrants or pears.
- D Grapefruit juice and orange juice other than unpasteurised frozen orange juice concentrate.
- W Extracts, essences or concentrates, of coffee, preparations with a basis of extracts, essences or concentrates of coffee.
- W Food preparations not elsewhere specified or included containing 50% or more by weight of butter fat (including hydrogenated butter fat and other chemically or physically modified butter fat).
- D Rum.
- NST Animal feeding stuffs containing more than 80% by weight of milk solids.
- D Cigars.
- E Benzole.
- E Petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals, crude.
- E Petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals, other than crude; preparations not elsewhere specified or included, containing not less than 70% by weight of petroleum oils or of oils obtained from bituminous minerals, these oils being the basic constituents of the preparations.
- E Petroleum gases and other gaseous hydrocarbons.
- E Paraffin wax.
- RO Petroleum waxes.
- W Plutonium, uranium 233, uranium enriched in the isotopes 233 or 235 and any mixture, compound or alloy containing any of the foregoing.
- E Hydrocarbons other than acetylene, dipentene, divinylbenzene, methylstyrene, pinene, terpinolene, tetraphenylbutadiene.
- E Lubricating preparations, and preparations of a kind used for oil or grease treatment of textiles, leather or other materials, but not including preparations containing 70% or more by weight of petroleum oils or of oils obtained from bituminous minerals.
- E Matches (excluding Bengal matches).
- E Anti-knock preparations, oxidation inhibitors, gum inhibitors, viscosity improvers, anti-corrosive preparations and similar prepared additives for mineral oils.

- E Hydrocarbon oils.
- E Detergent alkylates.
- E Gloves made from artificial resins and plastic materials, cellulose esters and ethers.
- E Gloves of unhardened vulcanised rubber.
- E Articles of apparel and clothing accessories, of leather or of composition leather.
- W Vicuna skin.
- E Gloves of furskin.
- E Gloves of artificial fur.
- E Silk yarn not put up for retail sale
- E Silk yarn put up for retail sale, other than yarn spun from noil or other waste silk.
- E Woven fabrics of silk or of waste silk, of a weight exceeding 12 oz. per 7 sq.yd. if undischarged or exceeding 10 oz. per 7 sq.yd. if discharged or partly discharged.
- E Woven fabrics of noil silk, of a weight exceeding 12 oz. per 7 sq.yd. if undischarged or exceeding 10 oz. per 7 sq.yd. if discharged or partly discharged.
- E.J. ... Woven fabrics of man-made fibres (continuous), including woven fabrics of monofil or strip.
- E Metallised yarn.
- J Metallised yarn, being cotton yarn spun with metal or covered with metal by any process.
- E Woven fabrics of metal thread or of metallised yarn, of a kind used in articles of apparel, as furnishing fabrics or the like.
- J Woven fabrics of metallised yarn of cotton or of manmade fibres, of a kind used in articles of apparel, as furnishing fabrics or the like.
- W Vicuna hair, not carded or combed.
- W Vicuna hair, carded or combed.
- E.J. ... Woven fabrics of sheep's or lambs' wool or of fine animal hair.

- E Other articles made from yarn, twine, cordage, rope or cables (other than textile fabrics and articles made from such fabrics), of yarn of jute, of flax or of hemp.
- E Textile fabrics coated with gum or amylaceous substances, of a kind used for the outer covers of books and the like; tracing cloth; prepared painting canvas; buckram and similar fabrics for hat foundations and similar uses.
- J Cotton fabrics coated with gum or amylaceous substances, of a kind used for book covers and the like; cotton tracing cloth and prepared painting canvas.
- E.J. Textile fabrics impregnated or coated with preparations of cellulose derivatives or of other artificial plastic materials, of cotton.
- E.J. Textile fabrics coated or impregnated with oil or preparations with a basis of drying oil, of cotton.
- E Rubberised textile fabrics, other than rubberised knitted or crocheted goods.

- E Wicks wholly or mainly of woven cotton.
- E.J. ... Cotton hosepiping and similar tubing, with or without lining, armour or accessories of other materials.
- E.J. ... Transmission, conveyor or elevator belts or belting, whether or not strengthened with metal or other materials, of cotton.
- E.J. ... Textile products and textile articles of a kind commonly used in machinery or plant, of cotton.
- E.J. ... Knitted or crocheted fabric, not elastic nor rubberised, wholly or mainly of man-made fibres, other than fabric resembling lace.
- E Gloves, mittens and mitts, not elastic nor rubberised, knitted or crocheted to shape.
- E.J. ... Stockings, under stockings, socks, ankle-socks, sockettes and the like, knitted or crocheted, not elastic nor rubberised, wholly or mainly of cotton, of man-made fibres or of wool.
- E.J. ... Under-garments, knitted or crocheted, not elastic nor rubberised, wholly or mainly of cotton, of man-made fibres or of wool.
- E Outer garments, and other articles of apparel, knitted or crocheted, not elastic nor rubberised, wholly or mainly of cotton, of man-made fibres, of wool or of fine animal hair. Bed linen, table linen, curtains and other furnishing articles, knitted or crocheted, not elastic nor rubberised wholly or mainly of cotton or of man-made fibres. Other articles for house-hold use, knitted or crocheted, not elastic nor rubberised, wholly or mainly of man-made fibres, of wool or of fine animal hair.
- J Outer garments, knitted or crocheted, not elastic nor rubberised, wholly or mainly of cotton, of man-made fibres or of wool and including such minor articles of apparel as shawls, mufflers, scarves and the like.
- E Bed linen, table linen, curtains and other furnishing articles, knitted or crocheted, elastic or rubberised, wholly or mainly of cotton or of man-made fibres. Other articles for house-hold use, knitted or crocheted, elastic or rubberised, wholly or mainly of man-made fibres or of wool.
- E Men's and boys' outer garments wholly or mainly of woven cotton, of man-made fibres, of flax, of ramie or of hemp.
- J Men's and boys' outer garments wholly or mainly of cotton or of man-made fibres.
- E Women's, girls' and infants' outer garments wholly or mainly of woven cotton, of man-made fibres, of flax, of ramie or of hemp.

- J Women's, girls' and infants' outer garments, wholly or mainly of cotton or of man-made fibres.
- E Men's and boys' under garments, including collars, shirt fronts and cuffs, wholly or mainly of woven cotton, of flax, of ramie or of hemp.
- J Men's and boys' under garments, including collars, shirt fronts and cuffs, wholly or mainly of cotton.
- E Women's, girls' and infants' under garments wholly or mainly of woven cotton, of flax, of ramie or of hemp
- J Women's, girls' and infants' under garments, wholly or mainly of cotton.
- E Handkerchiefs wholly or mainly of woven cotton, of man-made fibres, of flax, of ramie or of hemp.
- J Handkerchiefs (except those of silk or of linen).
- E Shawls, scarves, mufflers, mantillas, veils and the like, wholly or mainly of woven cotton, of man-made fibres, of flax, of ramie or of hemp.
- J Shawls, scarves, mufflers and the like (except those of silk or of linen).
- E Ties, bow-ties and cravats wholly or mainly of woven cotton, of flax, of ramie or of hemp.
- J Ties, bow-ties and cravats, wholly or mainly of cotton.
- E Collars, tuckers, fallals, bodice-fronts, jabots, cuffs, flounces, yokes and similar accessories and trimmings for women's and girls' garments, wholly or mainly of woven cotton, of flax, of ramie or of hemp.
- J Collars, tuckers, fallals, bodice-fronts, jabots, cuffs, flounces, yokes and similar accessories and trimmings for women's and girls' garments, wholly or mainly of cotton.
- E.J. ... Corsets, corset-belts, suspender-belts, brassieres, braces, suspenders, garters and the like, wholly or mainly of woven cotton.
- E Gloves, mittens, mitts, stockings, socks and sockettes, wholly or mainly of woven cotton, of flax, of ramie or of hemp.
- J Gloves, mittens and mitts wholly or mainly of woven cotton.
- E Made-up accessories for articles of apparel, wholly or mainly of woven cotton, of flax, of ramie or of hemp.
- J Made-up accessories for articles of apparel (for example, dress shields, shoulder and other pads, belts, muffs, sleeve protectors, pockets, removable linings), wholly or mainly of cotton.
- E Travelling rugs and blankets, wholly or mainly of woven cotton, of man-made fibres, of wool or of fine animal
- J Travelling rugs and blankets, wholly or mainly of cotton.
- E Bed linen, table linen, toilet linen, kitchen linen, curtains and other furnishing articles, wholly or mainly of woven cotton, of man-made fibres, of flax, of ramie or of hemp.

- J Bed linen, table linen, toilet linen and kitchen linen, wholly or mainly of cotton; curtains and other furnishing articles, wholly or mainly of cotton.
- W New sacks and bags of jute.
- E Tarpaulins, sails, awnings, sunblinds, tents and camping goods, wholly or mainly of woven cotton, of flax, of hemp or of jute.
- E Other textile articles made up from fabrics exceeding 30 cm. in width.
- J Other made-up cotton articles for household use including such articles as shopping, laundry and garment bags and dusters; other made-up cotton articles being dress patterns, garment bags, flat protective sheets, packing cloths and cheese cloths; other made-up cotton articles made from narrow fabrics not exceeding 30 cm. in width.
- E Clothing, clothing accessories, travelling rugs and blankets, household linen and furnishing articles of textile materials, footwear and headgear of any material, showing signs of appreciable wear and imported in bulk or in bales, sacks or similar bulk packings.
- E Footwear with outer soles and uppers of rubber or artificial plastic material.
- E Footwear with outer soles of leather or composition leather; footwear with outer soles of rubber or artificial plastic material.
- E Hat-forms, hat bodies and hoods of felt, neither blocked to shape nor with made brims; plateaux and manchons (including slit manchons), of felt, felt hats and other felt headgear, whether or not lined or trimmed.
- E Hat-shapes, plaited or made from plaited or other strips of any material, neither blocked to shape nor with made brims, other than Panama hat hoods.
- E Hats and other headgear, plaited or made from plaited or other strips of any material, whether or not lined or trimmed, other than Panama hat hoods.
- E Hats and other headgear (including hair nets), knitted or crocheted, or made up from lace, felt or other textile fabric in the piece (but not from strips), whether or not lined or trimmed.
- E Other headgear, whether or not lined or trimmed.
- E Head-bands, linings, covers, hat foundations, hat frames (including spring frames for opera hats), peaks and chinstraps, for headgear.
- E Tableware and other articles of a kind commonly used for domestic or toilet purposes, of porcelain or china (including biscuit porcelain and parian).
- E Tableware and other articles of a kind commonly used for domestic or toilet purposes of other kinds of pottery.
- E Ceramic statuettes and other ornaments and articles of personal adornment; ceramic articles of furniture.

Pottery, domestic, not certified by the Japanese Pottery Design Center to be of traditional Japanese design, the following:-

- J Tableware and other articles of a kind commonly used for domestic or toilet purposes, of porcelain or china (including biscuit porcelain and parian).
- J Tableware and other articles of a kind commonly used for domestic or toilet purposes, of other kinds of pottery.
- J Statuettes and other ornaments, articles of furniture
- J Articles of domestic pottery.
- E Enamelled hollow-ware.
- RO Unwrought aluminium; aluminium waste and scrap.
- RO Wrought bars, rods, angles, shapes and sections, of aluminium; aluminium wire.
- RO Wrought plates, sheets and strip (including discs and circles) of aluminium.
- RO Aluminium foil.
- RO Aluminium powders and flakes.
- RO Tubes, pipes and blanks therefor, of aluminium; hollow bars of aluminium.
- E Transistorised radio broadcast receivers and transistorised television broadcast receivers, of the domestic or portable type or designed or adapted for fitting to motor vehicles (including those incorporating gramophones or other sound reproducers).
- E Thermionic, cold cathode and photo cathode valves and tubes; photocells; mounted transistors and similar mounted devices incorporating semi-conductors; mounted piezo-electric crystals.
- E Aircraft of an all-up weight exceeding 4,500 lb.
- E Watches of a value not exceeding £1.50 each cif (not including the value of any strap, bracelet or similar attachment) other than stop-watches not capable of indicating the time of day.
- E Clocks with watch movements.
- E Non-electric clocks.
- E Non-electric apparatus capable of indicating the time of day.
- E Watch movements of a value not exceeding £1.25 each cif.
- E Non-electric clock movements.
- E Other watch and clock parts.
- W Firearms and ammunition, the following:-
 - (i) firearms, lethal, including any lethal barrelled weapon of any description from which any shot, bullet or other missile can be discharged and other weapons of whatever description designed or adapted for the discharge of any noxious liquid, gas or other thing;

- (ii) component parts (other than wooden gun stocks) of any such firearms or other weapon as afore-said and any accessory to any such firearm or other weapon designed or adapted to diminish the noise or flash caused by firing the weapon;
- (iii) ammunition, including grenades, bombs, and other like missiles, and any ammunition containing or designed or adapted to contain any noxious liquid, gas or other thing and component parts of any such ammunition;

other than the following:

- (a) cartridges for smooth-bore guns, being cartridges containing five or more shots none of which exceeds 0.36 in. in diameter;
- (b) blank cartridges not exceeding 1 in. in diameter for use in smooth-bore weapons;
- (c) air guns, air rifles or air pistols incapable of discharging a missile so that the missile has, on being discharged from the muzzle of the weapon, kinetic energy in excess, in the case of an air pistol, of 6 ft. lb or, in the case of an air weapon other than an air pistol, of 12 ft. lb, and air weapons designed for use only under water;
- (d) ammunition for air guns, air rifles or air pistols;
- (e) articles more than one hundred years old.

E Christmas tree decorations of glass.

SECOND SCHEDULE

Description of Goods

Metallised yarn, being cotton yarn spun with metal or covered with metal by any process.

Woven fabrics of metallised yarn of cotton, of a kind used in articles of apparel, as furnishing fabrics or the like.

Cotton yarn, not put up for retail sale.

Cotton yarn, put up for retail sale.

Cotton gauze.

Terry towelling and similar terry fabrics, containing more than 50% by weight of cotton.

Other woven fabrics containing more than 50% by weight of cotton.

Woven pile fabrics and chenille fabrics, containing more than 50% by weight of cotton.

Embroidery, in the piece, in strips or in motifs, containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Goods containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton, the following: textile fabrics coated with gum or amylaceous substances of a kind used for the outer covers of books and the like; tracing cloth; prepared painting canvas; buckram and similar fabrics for hat foundations and similar uses.

Textile fabrics impregnated or coated with preparations of cellulose derivatives or of other artificial plastic materials, containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Textile fabrics containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton, coated or impregnated with oil or preparations with a basis of drying oil.

Rubberised fabrics containing more than 50% by weight of cotton, other than rubberised knitted or crocheted goods.

Textile fabrics containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton, the following: fabrics otherwise impregnated or coated: painted textile fabrics being theatrical scenery, studio backcloths or the like.

Elastic fabrics and trimmings consisting of textile materials combined with rubber threads (other than knitted or crocheted goods) containing more than 50% by weight of cotton.

Wicks containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Hosepiping and similar tubing, containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Transmission, conveyor or elevator belts or belting, containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Textile products and textile articles of a kind commonly used in machinery or plant, containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Men's and boys' outer garments, containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Women's, girls' and infants' under garments, containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Handkerchiefs containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Shawls, scarves, mufflers, mantillas, veils and the like, containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Ties, bow-ties and cravats, containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Collars, tuckers, fallals, bodice-fronts, jabots, cuffs, flounces, yokes and similar accessories and trimmings for women's and girls' garments, containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Corsets, corset-belts, suspender-belts, brassieres, braces, suspenders, garters and the like, containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Gloves, mittens, mitts, stockings, socks and sockettes, containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Made-up accessories for articles of apparel, containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Travelling rugs and blankets, containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Bed linen, table linen, toilet linen and kitchen linen, containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton; curtains and other furnishing articles, containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Tarpaulins, sails, awnings, sunblinds, tents and camping goods, containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

Other made-up textile articles (including dress patterns) containing more than 50% by weight of woven cotton.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Licence but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This Licence replaces the Open General Import Licence granted by the Board of Administration on the 21st February, 1967, and the amendments thereto.

The form of the new Licence differs considerably from that of the previous one and there are also some changes in licensing arrangements.

Subject to certain overriding exceptions set out in Article 5 relating to Southern Rhodesia and plumage, all goods which are not included in either of the two Schedules may be imported under the authority of this Licence.

Goods comprised in the First Schedule may be imported under the Licence except in certain cases when an individual import licence will be required. The following series of key letters is employed to indicate such exceptions:-

'W' indicates goods which may not in any circumstances be imported under the licence;

'D' indicates goods which may not be imported under the Licence if they originate in or are consigned from the 'Dollar Area' (defined in Article 1);

'E' indicates goods which may not be imported under the Licence if they originate in or are consigned from the Eastern Area (defined in Article 1);

'J' indicates goods which may not be imported under the Licence if they originate in Japan unless they are consigned from Japan under the authority of the Japanese government;

'RO' indicates goods which may not be imported under the Licence if they originate in or are consigned from Romania;

'NST' indicates goods which may not be imported under the Licence if they originate in or are consigned from a country outside the Scheduled Territories (defined in Article 1).

Goods comprised in the Second Schedule (cotton textiles) may be imported under the Licence only in the five cases mentioned in Article 4 of the Licence.

The overriding exceptions set out in Article 5 also apply in relation to goods mentioned in the Schedules and the provisions allowing the import of goods mentioned in the First Schedule do not extend to permitting the import of goods which are also mentioned in the Second Schedule.

The Licence does not relieve importers from compliance with any other restrictions to which the goods may be subject, including restrictions on, or the prohibition of, imports by any enactment other than Orders made under Article 1 of the Import and Export (Control) (Guernsey) Law, 1946.
