

The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets)(No.3)
Regulations, 1970.

Made the 14th day of January, 1970.

Coming into operation on 1st February, 1970.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Traffic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty nine (a), and the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950 (b), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island. -

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer of Police, drive or ride that vehicle or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along:-

(a) La Route des Coutures (Saints Road), Saint Martin's, from its junction with La Grande Rue to its junction with Longue Rue (Burnt Lane), otherwise than from Northeast to Southwest;

(b) Longue Rue (Burnt Lane), Saint Martin's, otherwise than from South to North.

2. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the expressions "animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings respectively assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Traffic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty nine.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including these Regulations.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets)(No. 3) Regulations, 1970.

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of February, nineteen hundred and seventy, and shall continue in force until the thirty-first day of July, nineteen hundred and seventy.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This note forms no part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport).

The effect of these Regulations is that for a period of six months from 1st February, 1970 :-

(a) That portion of Route des Coucours (Saints Road), Saint Martin's from its junction with La Grande Rue to its junction with Longue Rue (Burnt Lane), will be a one-way street, traffic being required to proceed in a southwesterly direction only;

(b) Longue Rue (Burnt Lane), Saint Martin's, will be a one-way street, traffic being required to proceed in a northerly direction only.
