IMPORT AND EXPORT (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) LAW, 1946

THE IMPORT AND EXPORT OF GOODS (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1955

AMENDMENT TO OPEN GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE

WHEREAS by the Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1955, dated the 14th June, 1955 (a), the importation into Guernsey of goods consigned from a place outside the United Kingdom, the Island of Jersey, the other Islands of the Bailiwick of Guernsey or the Isle of Man is prohibited unless under the authority of a licence granted by or on behalf of the States Board of Administration:

NOW THEREFORE the States Board of Administration, in exercise of its powers under Article 2 of the above-mentioned Order, hereby authorises as follows:

1. The Open General Import Licence made by the States Board of Administration and dated the twenty first day of February, nineteen hundred and sixty seven, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:-

(a) the First Schedule thereto is hereby deleted and the Schedule set out in the Schedule to this Amendment is hereby substituted therefor;

(b) in Group 1 of the Second Schedule thereto the entry relating to fats, greases and oils, animal, other than butter and goods containing 50% or more by weight of butterfat, is hereby deleted and the following entry is hereby substituted therefor:

"Fats, greases and oils, animal, other than butter and goods containing 50% or more by weight of butterfat whether or not hydrogenated or otherwise chemically or physically modified";

(c) in Group 1 of the Second Schedule thereto the entry relating to margarine imitation lard and other prepared edible fats, containing less than 50% by weight of butterfat, is hereby deleted and the following entry is hereby substituted therefor:-

"Margarine, imitation lard and other prepared edible fats, containing less than 50% by weight of butterfat whether or not hydrogenated or otherwise chemically or physically modified".

2. This Amendment shall take effect on the first day of February, nineteen hundred and seventy, and may be modified or revoked at any time by the States Board of Administration.

SCHEDULE

"SCHEDULE 1

General Note:

- (1) The issue of this Open General Import Licence does not relieve importers from compliance with any other restrictions to which the goods may be subject, including restrictions on, or the prohibition of, imports by any enactment other than Orders made under Article 1 of the Import and Export (Control) (Guernsey) Law, 1946.
- (2) No description in this Schedule shall be deemed to refer to goods which are proved to the satisfaction of the Board of Administration to have been manufactured or produced more than one hundred years before the date of importation.

S....Animals and other mammals.

S....Animal and Poultry excrement.

S....Butter and goods containing 50% or more by weight of butterfat, whether or not hydrogenated or otherwise chemically or physically modified, other than ghee, cheese or cream.

S....Caravans

D....Cigars

Coal, coke and solid fuels manufactured from coal or coke.

S....Coal, coke and solid fuels manufactured from coal or coke, originating in or consigned from the Republic of Ireland.

S....Coffee (other than husks or skins) and extracts, essences or concentrates of coffee and preparations based thereon.

S....Plumage, being feathers or skins or other parts of birds with their feathers, and articles consisting wholly or partly of plumage, other than:

(i) Plumage of the undermentioned birds:-

Birds ordinarily used in the United Kingdom as articles of diet.

African ostrich.

Eider duck.

Rhea Rothschildi-Order Rheiformes.

Common jay (Garrulus Glandarius) - Order Passeriformes.

Common magpie (Pica Pica) - Order Passeriformes.

Common starling (Sturnus Vulgaris) - Order Passeriformes.

Java sparrow (Munia Oryzivora) - Order Passeriformes.

West African ring-necked parrakeet (Palaeornis Docilis) - Order Psittaciformes.

Chinese bustard (Otis Tarda Dybowskyi) - Order Charadriiformes.

Golden pheasant (Crysolophus Pictus) - Order Galliformes.

Common cormorant (Phalacrocorax Carbo) - Order Steganopodes.

Common shag (Phalacrocorax Aristotelis) - Order Steganopodes.

(ii) Articles consisting wholly or partly of plumage of the birds mentioned at (i) above, but not of any other birds provided that a written declaration is delivered to the proper officer of Customs containing a statement specifying the descriptions of the birds from which the plumage was obtained.

S....Firearms and ammunition, the following:-

- (i) firearms, lethal, including any lethal barrelled weapon of any description from which any shot, bullet or other missile can be discharged and other weapons of whatever description designed or adapted for the discharge of any noxious liquid, gas or other thing;
- (ii) component parts (other than wooden gun stocks) of any such firearms or other weapon as aforesaid and any accessory to any such firearm or other weapon designed or adapted to diminish the noise or flash caused by firing the weapon; and
- (iii) ammunition, including grenades, bombs, and other like missiles, and any ammunition containing or designed or adapted to contain any noxious liquid, gas or other thing and component parts of any such ammunition;

other than the following:-

- (a) cartridges for smooth bore guns, being cartridges containing five or more shots, none of which exceeds 0.36 inch in diameter;
- (b) blank cartridges not exceeding one inch in diameter for use in smooth bore weapons;
- (c) air guns, air rifles or air pistols incapable of discharging a missile so that the missile has, on being discharged from the muzzle of the weapon kinetic energy in excess, in the case of an air pistol, of 6 ft. lb. or, in the case of an air weapon other than an air pistol, of 12 ft. lb., and air weapons designed for use only under water;
- (d) ammunition for air guns, air rifles or air pistols.

Fruit and fruit products, the following:-

Apples and pears, fresh.

D....Bananas.

D....Grapefruit - fresh, bottled or canned.

S....Grapefruit not grown in the country or territory from which it is consigned and mixtures of fruit containing such grapefruit, bottled or canned.

D....Grapefruit juice.

D....Orange juice other than unpasteurised frozen orange juice concentrate.

S....Gold medals, medallions, tablets and other such pieces in pictorial relief or bearing inscriptions, other than those weighing not more than five pennyweights and of a value not exceeding £2. 10s. 0d.

S....Gold coins.

Meat and meat products, the following:-

D....Hams, whole, other than hams preserved in air-tight containers.

Milk and milk products, the followings:-

Milk (including buttermilk, skim milk and whey) - fresh, frozen, evaporated, condensed, dried or otherwise preserved.

Animal feeding stuffs, containing more than 80 per cent. by weight of milk solids.

Pottery, domestic, originating in or consigned from Japan other than articles originating in Japan and consigned to the United Kingdom from Japan under authority of the Government of that country and articles certified by the Japanese Pottery Design Center to be of traditional Japanese design, the following:-

- (i) Tableware and other articles of a kind commonly used for domestic or toilet purposes, of porcelain, or china (including biscuit porcelain and parian), or of other kinds of pottery.

Statuettes and other ornaments, articles of furniture.

Articles of domestic pottery falling within tariff heading 69.14.

S....Potatoes, fresh, other than:-

- (i) new potatoes, being potatoes which have been dug when immature for marketing without delay, the skins of which can be removed by rubbing with the fingers or show evidence of natural skinning at the time of importation, and which are imported during the period from 1st November, of any one year to 31st August of the next.
- (ii) sweet potatoes.

S....Radioactive substances, the following:-

Plutonium
Uranium 233
Uranium enriched in the isotopes 233 or 235
Any mixture, compound or alloy containing any of the foregoing.

D....Rum.

S....Seeds, the following:-

Clover
Grass

S....Sugar of a polarisation exceeding 98 degrees

Textile manufactures, the following:-

S....Jute manufactures, the following:-

Woven piece goods exceeding 18 inches in width.

New sacks and bags.

Yarn.

S....Cotton yarns and manufactures wholly or mainly of woven cotton other than the following:-

- (a) Carpets, mats or rugs;

- (b) Sacks and bags falling within heading 62.03 of the Customs Tariff set out in column 1 of Schedule 2 to the Import Duties (Bailiwick of Guernsey)(No. 57) Order, 1969 (a);
- (c) Narrow fabrics and manufactures falling within headings 58.05, 58.06 and 58.07 of the Customs Tariff set out as aforesaid;
- (d) Handloom products originating in and consigned from India;
- (e) Yarns and manufactures originating in any of the following countries:-
 - Australia, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Denmark, Finland, France, the Federal Republic of Germany, Iceland, Italy, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Sweden, Switzerland, the United States of America, and consigned from any such country;
- (f) Yarns and manufactures originating in and consigned from the Irish Republic;
- (g) Yarns and manufactures originating in and consigned to the United Kingdom from Portugal under the authority of the Government of that country;
- (h) Yarns and manufactures originating in and consigned from Japan not being goods the importation of which is prohibited by virtue of the next following entry in this Schedule.

Textile manufactures originating in or consigned from Japan, other than manufactures originating in Japan and consigned to the United Kingdom from Japan under the authority of the Government of that country, the following:-

- Woven fabrics of man-made fibres (continuous), including woven fabrics of monofil or strip of tariff headings 51.01 or 51.02.
- Metallized yarn, being cotton yarn spun with metal or covered with metal by any process.
- Woven fabrics of metal thread or of metallized yarn; of cotton or of man-made fibres, of a kind used in articles of apparel, as furnishing fabrics or the like.
- Woven fabrics of sheep's or lamb's wool or of fine animal hair.
- Cotton yarn, not put up for retail sale.
- Cotton yarn, put up for retail sale.
- Cotton gauze
- Terry towelling and similar terry fabrics, of cotton.
- Other woven fabrics of cotton.
- Yarn of man-made fibres, (discontinuous or waste), not put up for retail sale.
- Woven fabrics of man-made fibres (discontinuous or waste).
- Woven pile fabrics and chenille fabrics wholly or mainly of cotton or of man-made fibres (other than terry towelling and similar terry fabrics within tariff heading 55.08 and fabrics falling within tariff heading 58.05).
- Narrow woven fabrics, and narrow fabrics (bolduc) consisting of warp without weft assembled by means of an adhesive, other than goods falling within tariff heading 58.06.
- Woven labels, badges and the like, not embroidered, in the piece, in strips, or cut to shape or size.
- Nets and netting knotted, made of yard.

- Nets and netting made of twine, cordage or rope, and made-up fishing nets of twine, cordage or rope.
- Textile fabrics of cotton, coated with gum or amylaceous substances, of a kind used for book covers and the like; tracing cloth of cotton; prepared painting canvas of cotton.
- Textile fabrics impregnated or coated with preparations of cellulose derivatives or of other artificial plastic materials, of cotton.
- Textile fabrics coated or impregnated with oil or preparations with a basis of drying oil, of cotton.
- Rubberized textile fabrics, other than rubberized knitted or crocheted goods, of cotton.
- Textile fabrics otherwise impregnated or coated of cotton.
- Elastic fabrics and trimmings not exceeding 30 cms. in width (other than knitted or crocheted) consisting wholly or mainly of cotton or man-made fibre textile materials combined with rubber threads.
- Elastic fabrics and trimmings exceeding 30 cms. in width (other than knitted or crocheted) consisting of textile materials combined with rubber threads.
- Textile hosepiping and similar tubing, with or without lining, armour or accessories of other materials, of cotton.
- Transmission, conveyor or elevator belts or belting, whether or not strengthened with metal or other material, of cotton.
- Textile products and textile articles of a kind commonly used in machinery or plant, of cotton.
- Knitted or crocheted fabric, not elastic nor rubberized, wholly or mainly of man-made fibres, other than knitted or crocheted net fabric and fabric resembling lace.
- Stockings, under-stockings, socks, ankle-socks, sockettes and the like, knitted or crocheted, not elastic nor rubberized, wholly or mainly of cotton, man-made fibres or wool.
- Undergarments, knitted or crocheted, not elastic nor rubberized, wholly or mainly of cotton, man-made fibres or wool.
- Outer garments, knitted or crocheted, not elastic nor rubberized, wholly or mainly of cotton, man-made fibres or wool, and including such minor articles of apparel as shawls, mufflers, scarves and the like.
- Knitted or crocheted fabrics and articles of apparel, elastic or rubberized (including elastic knee-caps and elastic stockings) including shaped parts thereof, wholly or mainly of man-made fibres.
- Men's and boys' outer garments wholly or mainly of cotton or man-made fibres.
- Women's, girls' and infants' outer garments wholly or mainly of cotton or man-made fibres.
- Men's and boys' undergarments including collars, shirt fronts and cuffs, wholly or mainly of cotton.
- Women's, girls' and infants' undergarments wholly or mainly of cotton.
- Handkerchiefs (except those of silk or linen).
- Shawls, scarves, mufflers and the like (except those of silk or of linen).
- Ties, bow-ties and cravats, wholly or mainly of cotton.
- Collars, tuckers, fallals, fronts, jabots, cuffs, flounces, yokes and similar accessories and trimmings for women's and girls' garments, wholly or mainly of cotton.
- Corsets, corset belts, suspender belts, brassieres, braces, suspenders, garters and the like wholly or mainly of woven cotton.
- Gloves, mittens and mitts wholly or mainly of woven cotton.
- Made-up accessories for articles of apparel (e.g. dress shields, shoulder and other pads, belts, muffs, sleeve protectors, pockets, removable linings) wholly or mainly of cotton.
- Travelling rugs and blankets wholly or mainly of cotton.
- Bed linen, table linen, toilet linen and kitchen linen, wholly or mainly of cotton; curtains and other furnishing articles wholly or mainly of cotton.

Other made-up textile articles of cotton made from narrow fabrics not exceeding 30 centimetres in width.

Other made-up textile articles of cotton for household use including such articles as shopping, laundry and garment bags and dusters.

Other made-up textile articles of cotton - dress patterns, garment bags, flat protective sheets, packing cloths, cheese cloths, and the like. "

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Amendment to the Open General Import Licence but is intended to indicate its general purport).

The main effect of this Amendment is that -

- (a) the existing entry in Schedule 1 relating to plumage is re-defined;
- (b) the textile manufactures specified in the Amendment to Schedule 2 are those still subject to restrictions when originating in or consigned from Japan;
- (c) individual import licences will now be required for a number of products containing butterfat whether or not hydrogenated or otherwise chemically or physically modified.
