The Social Insurance (Obligations of Employers)  
(Amendment) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1970.

Made.....12th February, 1970

Coming into Operation ..... 2nd March, 1970

THE STATES INSURANCE AUTHORITY, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section forty-three and section seventy-seven of the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1964, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

Amendment to principal regulations

1. Immediately after paragraph two of regulation two of the Social Insurance (Obligations of Employers) (Guernsey) Regulations 1964, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations") there is hereby inserted the following additional paragraph:-

"(3) If any employer contravenes or fails to comply with any requirement of this regulation, he shall be guilty of an offence and liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding ten pounds, or where the offence consists of continuing any such contravention or failure after conviction thereof, ten pounds together with a further ten pounds for each day on which it is so continued.

Citation and commencement

2. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Social Insurance (Obligations of Employers) (Amendment) Regulations, 1970, and these regulations and the principal regulations may be cited together as the Social Insurance (Obligations of Employers) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1964 and 1970.

(2) These regulations shall come into operation on the second day of March, nineteen hundred and seventy.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

These regulations make it an offence for an employer not to comply with his obligations under paragraph (1) or (2) of the Social Insurance (Obligations of Employers) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1964.
