

The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets)
(No. 6) Regulations, 1970.

Made the 6th day of April, 1970.

Coming into operation on the 20th day of April, 1970.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine (a), and the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950 (b), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island:-

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, drive or ride that vehicle or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along:-

(a) Saumarez Street, Saint Peter Port, otherwise than from South to North;

(b) Little Saint John Street, Saint Peter Port, from its junction with Union Street to its junction with Saumarez Street, otherwise than in an anti-clockwise direction.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (b) of section one of the Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinance, 1970 (c), a person in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, drive or ride that vehicle or permit that animal to proceed on or along Clifton, Saint Peter Port, otherwise than from North to South.

3. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal and driving or riding that vehicle or permitting that animal to proceed from South to North along Saumarez Street, Saint Peter Port, shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, turn that vehicle or permit that animal to turn to the right at its junction with Grange Road.

4. (1) In these Regulations unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them:-

"animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine;

"Chief Officer" means the Chief Officer of the Island Police Force.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including these Regulations.

5. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets)(No.6) Regulations, 1970.

6. These Regulations shall come into force on the twentieth day of April, nineteen hundred and seventy, and shall continue in force until the nineteenth day of October, nineteen hundred and seventy.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note forms no part of the Regulations but it is intended to indicate their general purport).

The effect of these Regulations is that for a period of six months from the twentieth day of April, nineteen hundred and seventy:-

- (a) Saumarez Street, Saint Peter Port, will be a one-way street, traffic being required to proceed from South Clifton to Grange Road;
- (b) Little Saint John Street, Saint Peter Port, will be a one-way street, from its junction with Union Street to its junction with Saumarez Street, traffic being required to proceed away from Union Street;
- (c) Clifton, Saint Peter Port, will continue to be a one-way street, but traffic will be required to proceed in a southerly direction only (i.e. in the opposite direction to that previously allowed);
- (d) traffic will not be able to turn right from Saumarez Street into Grange Road.
