THE ROAD TRAFFIC (PROHIBITED AND ONE-WAY STREETS)(No.7)
REGULATIONS, 1970.

Made the 26th day of May, 1970.

Coming into operation on the 1st day of June, 1970.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine (a), and the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950(b), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island:-

1. Paragraph (a) of regulation one of the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets)(No.6) Regulations, 1970 (c), is hereby repealed and the following paragraph is hereby substituted therefor:-

"(a) Saumarez Street, Saint Peter Port, from its junction with Union Street to its junction with North Clifton, otherwise than from South to North;"

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets)(No.7) Regulations, 1970.

3. These Regulations shall come into force on the first day of June, nineteen hundred and seventy, and shall continue in force until the nineteenth day of October, nineteen hundred and seventy.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note forms no part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport).

These Regulations amend the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) (No.6) Regulations, 1970, to provide that from the 1st June, 1970, to the 19th October, 1970, the southern part of Saumarez Street, Saint Peter Port, from its junction with Union Street to its junction with South Clifton and Little St. John Street, will cease to be a one-way street.
