The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets)  
(No. 2) Regulations, 1969

Made the 21st May, 1969.

Coming into operation on 9th June, 1969.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine(a), and the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950(b), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island:-

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer of Police, drive or ride that vehicle or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along:-

- (a) La Neuve Rue, Saint Peter Port, otherwise than from South to North;
- (b) that junction of Skin's Lane, Saint Peter Port, between its junction with Courtil Bris and its junction with La Neuve Rue, otherwise than from West to East;
- (c) the unnamed lane between Collings Road, St. Peter Port and the Water Lane, St. Peter Port, on the East side of a property called "Engledene", Collings Road, and adjacent thereto, otherwise than from South to North.

2. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the expressions "animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings respectively assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty nine.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including these Regulations.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-way Streets) (No. 2) Regulations, 1969.

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the 9th day of June, nineteen hundred and sixty-nine and shall continue in force until the 8th day of December, nineteen hundred and sixty-nine.
