The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) (No.4)
Regulations, 1969

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine (a) and the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950(b), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island:-

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, drive or ride that vehicle, or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along:-

- (a) Rozel Road, Saint Peter Port, from its junction with Collings Road, to its junction with Saint Jacques, otherwise than from North to South;
- (b) Green Lanes, Saint Peter Port, from its junction with Courtil Saint Jacques Road to its junction with Collings Road, otherwise than from East to West;
- (c) Upper Saint Jacques Road, Saint Peter Port, from its junction with Rozel Road to its junction with ~~Gilanderie Road~~, otherwise than from North to South;
- (d) Brock Road, Saint Peter Port, from its junction with Grange Road to its junction with Doyle Road and Rouge Huis Avenue, otherwise than from South to North and West to East;
- (e) Doyle Road, Saint Peter Port, from its junction with Brock Road to its junction with Grange Road, otherwise than from North to South.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (b) of section one of the Prohibited and one-way Streets Ordinance, 1956(c), a person in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, drive or ride that vehicle or permit that animal to proceed on or along the road to the West of the South Plantation, South Esplanade, Saint Peter Port, otherwise than from South to North.

3. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them:-

"animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings respectively assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine;

"Chief Officer" means the Chief Officer of the Island Police Force.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment, including these Regulations.

4. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets)(No.4) Regulations, 1969.

5. These Regulations shall come into force on the 21st day of July, nineteen hundred and sixty nine, and shall continue in force until the 20th day of January, nineteen hundred and seventy.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This note forms no part of the Regulations
but is intended to indicate their general purport).

The effect of these Regulations is that for a period of six months from 21st July, 1969:

(a) Rozel Road, Saint Peter Port, from its junction with Collings Road to its junction with Saint Jacques, will be a one-way street, traffic being required to proceed in a southerly direction only;

(b) Green Lanes, Saint Peter Port, from its junction with Courtil Saint Jacques Road to its junction with Collings Road, will be a one-way street, traffic being required to proceed in a westerly direction only;

(c) Upper Saint Jacques Road, Saint Peter Port, from its junction with Rozel Road to its junction with Gibauderie Road, will be a one-way street; traffic being required to proceed in a southerly direction only;

(d) Brock Road, Saint Peter Port, from its junction with Grange Road to its junction with Doyle Road and Rouge Huis Avenue, will be a one-way street, traffic being required to proceed in a northerly and easterly direction only;

(e) Doyle Road, Saint Peter Port, from its junction with Brock Road to its junction with Grange Road, will be a one-way street, traffic being required to proceed in a southerly direction only;

(f) The road to West of the South Plantation, South Esplanade, Saint Peter Port, will continue to be a one-way street, but traffic will be required to proceed in a northerly direction.
