

THE EXPORT OF PRODUCE (OTHER THAN TOMATOES) ORDER, 1969

THE STATES COMMITTEE FOR HORTICULTURE, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by subsection (2) of section four of the Export of Produce (Other than Tomatoes) (Packing and Grading) Ordinance, 1956, as amended (a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

1. (1) The imprint on, or the label attached to, a container of produce in pursuance of subsection (1) of section four of the Export of Produce (Other than Tomatoes) (Packing and Grading) Ordinance, 1956, as amended (a), shall be in such form and contain such particulars as are specified in the succeeding subsections of this section.
  - (2) In the case of a container to be exported to any of the destinations specified in the left hand column of the First Schedule to this Order the imprint on or label attached to the container shall:-
    - (a) be of a minimum size of five inches in length and two and one-half inches in width;
    - (b) be coloured in such manner as is prescribed in the centre column of the said First Schedule in relation to the destination of the produce specified in the left hand column of that Schedule;
    - (c) be in the form and shall contain the particulars set out in the Second Schedule to this Order, namely:-
      - (i) the words "GUERNSEY PRODUCE",
      - (ii) the name and address of the consignee;
      - (iii) such number, in bold figures of not less than one and one quarter inches in height, as may be allocated from time to time by the Committee as respects such consignee;
      - (iv) the total number of boxes in the consignment; and
      - (v) the code letter and number allocated to the exporter by the Committee for the purposes of identification.

- (d) in addition, in the case of a container consigned to any of the markets in the London area specified in the left hand column of the said First Schedule, have thereon a cross in the colour specified in the right hand column of the said First Schedule in relation to the market so specified, in the manner set out in the Third Schedule to this Order.
- (3) In the case of a container to be exported to any destination in England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland or the Republic of Ireland, not specified in the left hand column of the First Schedule to this Order, the imprint on or label attached to the container shall:-
- (a) be of a minimum size of four inches in length and two and one-half inches in width;
- (b) be of the colour specified in the right hand column of the Fourth Schedule to this Order in relation to the destination of the produce specified in the left hand column of the said Fourth Schedule;
- (c) be in the form and shall contain the particulars set out in the Fifth Schedule to this Order, namely:-
- (i) the words "GUERNSEY PRODUCE";
- (ii) the name and the address of the consignee with the name of the destination in letters larger than the letters indicating the name of the consignee;
- (iii) the total number of boxes in the consignment;
- (iv) the code letter and number allocated to the exporter by the Committee for the purposes of identification.
- (d) in addition, in the case of a container consigned to any destination in Scotland, other than Glasgow, or to any destination in Wales, other than Cardiff, have thereon a bold line coloured black in the manner set out in the Sixth Schedule to this Order.
2. The Export of Produce (Other than Tomatoes) (No. 2) Order, 1964 and the Export of Produce (Other than Tomatoes) (No. 3) Order, 1964 (b) are hereby repealed.
3. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.
4. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and seventy.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This Order which comes into operation on the 1st January, 1970, extends with modifications and additions the coloured labelling system for the export of produce other than tomatoes prescribed in previous Orders which are now repealed.

The imprint or label on containers must show the number of boxes in the consignment in addition to the name and address and number (if any) of the consignee, the code letter and number of the exporter and the words "GUERNSEY PRODUCE". In order to ensure uniformity in labelling, the size of the labels for the various destinations and the manner in which details required are to be printed are set out in the Order and the Schedules thereto.
