The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets)

(No. 10) Regulations, 1969.

Made the 19th day of November, 1969.

Coming into operation on the 1st day of December, 1969.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine (a), and the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950 (b), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island:-

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer of Police, drive or ride that vehicle, or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along:-

- (a) La Planque Lane, Forest, from its junction with Forest Road to its junction with the unnamed lane west of La Planque Lane, otherwise than from South to North;
- (b) the unnamed lane west of La Planque Lane, Forest, from its junction with La Planque Lane to its junction with the Forest Road at the crossroads known as Mon Plaisir, otherwise than from North to South.

2. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the expressions "animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings respectively assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty nine.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment, including these Regulations.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets)(No.10) Regulations, 1969.

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the first day of December, nineteen hundred and sixty nine and shall continue in force until the thirty-first day of May, nineteen hundred and seventy.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note forms no part of the Regulations but it is intended to indicate their general purport).

The effect of these Regulations is that for a period of six months from the first December, nineteen hundred and sixty nine:-

- (a) La Planque Lane, Forest, from its junction with Forest Road to its junction with the unnamed lane west of La Planque Lane, will be a one-way street, traffic being required to proceed in a northerly direction only;
- (b) the unnamed lane west of La Planque Lane, Forest, from its junction with La Planque Lane to its junction with the Forest Road at the crossroads known as Mon Plaisir, will be a one-way street, traffic being required to proceed in a southerly direction only.
