The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One Way Streets)  
(No. 3) Regulations, 1967

Made the 6th April, 1967.

Coming into operation on 15th April, 1967.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine(a), and the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950(b), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island:-

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, drive or ride that vehicle, or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along Smith Street, High Street or The Pollet, Saint Peter Port -

(a) between the hours of midnight ending any day and ten o'clock in the forenoon of the day next following during the period commencing on the first day of May and terminating on the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven, or

(b) between the hours of six o'clock in the afternoon on any day and ten o'clock in the forenoon of the day next following either -

(i) during the period commencing on the fifteenth day of April and terminating on the thirtieth day of April, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven, or

(ii) during the period commencing on the first day of October and terminating on the fourteenth day of October, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven.

2.(1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:-

"animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings respectively assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine;

"Chief Officer" means the Chief Officer of the Island Police Force.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including these Regulations.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One Way Streets) (No.3) Regulations, 1967.

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the fifteenth day of April, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven, and shall continue in force until the fourteenth day of October, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note forms no part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

THE EFFECT OF THESE REGULATIONS, TOGETHER WITH PARAGRAPH (a) OF SECTION ONE OF THE PROHIBITED AND ONE WAY STREETS ORDINANCE, 1956, AS AMENDED, IS THAT, FOR THE PERIOD OF SIX MONTHS BEGINNING ON 15TH APRIL, 1967, SMITH STREET, HIGH STREET AND THE POLLET ARE COMPLETELY CLOSED TO VEHICULAR AND ANIMAL TRAFFIC THROUGHOUT THE TWENTY-FOUR HOURS OF EACH DAY (INCLUDING SUNDAYS AND BANK HOLIDAYS) EXCEPT WITH THE PERMISSION OF THE CHIEF OFFICER OF POLICE.
