The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-way Streets)  
(No.5) Regulations, 1967

Made the 25th May, 1967.

Coming into operation on 1st June, 1967.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine(a), and of the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance 1950(b), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island:-

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer of Police, drive or ride that vehicle or cause or permit that animal to proceed on or along -

- (a) the roads surrounding the premises known as "Petit Bôt Tea Rooms" in the parishes of the Forest and Saint Martin, otherwise than in a clockwise direction;
- (b) La Rue des Pages in the parish of Saint Martin, from the north-eastern corner of the premises known as "Petit Bôt Tea Rooms" to its most easterly junction with La Rue de la Falaise, otherwise than from South-West to North East, i.e. up-hill;

between the hours of ten o'clock in the forenoon and seven o'clock in the afternoon on any day.

2. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the expressions "animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings respectively assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including these Regulations.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) (No. 5) Regulations, 1967.

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the first day of June, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven, and shall continue in force until the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note forms no part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

The effect of these Regulations is that for a period of four months from 1st June, 1967, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. on each day -

- (a) the roads surrounding "Petit Bôt Tea Rooms" will be one-way streets, traffic being required to proceed along these roads in a clockwise direction, and
- (b) La Rue des Pages, Saint Martin's, from the north-eastern corner of "Petit Bôt Tea Rooms" to its most easterly junction with La Rue de la Falaise, will also be a one-way street, traffic being required to proceed in a north-easterly direction, i.e. up-hill.
