

The Road Traffic (Clearway) Regulations, 1967

Made the 26th June, 1967.

Coming into operation on 1st July, 1967.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine(a), and of the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950(b), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island:-

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer of Police, cause or permit that vehicle or animal to wait on any part of the carriageway of the South Esplanade, Saint Peter Port, to the west of the Bus Terminus between a traffic sign placed as near as may be to the offices of the British European Airways Corporation and a traffic sign placed as near as may be to the Picquet House, otherwise than to permit pedestrians to cross at the pedestrian crossing, on any week day between the hours of -

(a) twelve noon and one o'clock in the afternoon; and

(b) five o'clock in the afternoon and six o'clock in the afternoon.

2. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the expressions "animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings respectively assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including these Regulations.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Clearway) Regulations, 1967.

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven, and shall continue in force until the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note forms no part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

The effect of these Regulations is that for a period of six months from the 1st July, 1967, that part of the carriageway of the South Esplanade, Saint Peter Port, to the west of the Bus Terminus between the offices of British European Airways and the Picquet House will be a clearway, traffic being prohibited to stop otherwise than to permit pedestrians to cross at the pedestrian crossing, on any week day between the hours of -

- (a) twelve noon and one o'clock in the afternoon; and
- (b) five o'clock in the afternoon and six o'clock in the afternoon.
