The Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) (No. 3)
Regulations, 1966.

Made the 27th June, 1966.

Coming into operation on the 11th July, 1966.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine(a), and the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950(b), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating traffic in this Island:-

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (b) of section one of the Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinance, 1956(c), a person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer, drive or ride that vehicle or permit that animal to proceed on or along:-

- (a) Quay Street, Saint Peter Port, otherwise than from East to West;
- (b) Church Square, Saint Peter Port, otherwise than from North to South.

2. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:-

"animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings respectively assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine;

"the Chief Officer" means the Chief Officer of the Island Police Force.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these Regulations to any other enactment shall be construed as including a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including these Regulations.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Prohibited and One-Way Streets) (No. 3) Regulations, 1966.

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the eleventh day of July, nineteen hundred and sixty-six, and shall continue in force until the tenth day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note forms no part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

The effect of these Regulations is that for a period of six months from the 11th July, 1966 -

- (a) Quay Street will be a one-way street from East to West, that is to say, the reverse of what is permitted at the moment, so that vehicles will only be permitted to enter from the Quay,
- (b) Church Square becomes a one-way street from North to South, that is to say, no traffic will be permitted to enter the Square from Fountain Street but only from Quay Street or, in the case of vehicles whose drivers have a pass to use High Street, from High Street.
