

THE EXPORT OF PRODUCE (OTHER THAN TOMATOES)  
(NO.3) ORDER, 1964

THE STATES COMMITTEE FOR HORTICULTURE, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by subsection (2) of section four of the Export of Produce (Other than Tomatoes) (Packing and Grading) Ordinance, 1956(a), as amended (b), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

1. The Export of Produce (Other than Tomatoes) (No. 2) Order, 1964(c), is hereby amended, as follows.-

- (a) in sub-paragraph (v) of paragraph (c) of subsection (2) and in sub-paragraph (iv) of paragraph (c) of subsection (3) of section one thereof the words "name and address" are hereby repealed and the words "code letter and number allocated to the exporter by the Committee for the purposes of identification" are hereby substituted therefor;
- (b) in the Second, Third, Fourth, Sixth and Seventh Schedules thereto the words and brackets "(Name and address of Exporter)" are hereby repealed and the following words, figure and brackets are hereby substituted therefor -

"Code letter and number of Exporter  
 (Bold characters, minimum  $\frac{1}{2}$  in.)".

2. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.

Explanatory Note

This Order amends the Export of Produce (Other than Tomatoes) (No. 2) Order, 1964, to provide for the insertion on containers of produce other than tomatoes for export, or on a label attached thereto, of the code letter and number issued to the exporter by the Committee for the purposes of identification, in place of the exporter's name and address.
