The Road Traffic (One-Way Streets) Regulations, 1964.

THE ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred on it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, as amended, and of the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950, and of all other powers thereunto enabling it, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating vehicular traffic in this Island:-

1. A person, being in charge of a vehicle or animal, shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer of Police, proceed with that vehicle or animal on or along -

- (a) Cornet Street and Hauteville, Saint Peter Port, from the junction of Cornet Street with the South Esplanade to the junction of Hauteville with Havelet, otherwise than from East to West, that is upwards;
- (b) Havelet, Saint Peter Port, from its junction with Hauteville to a sign marked "No Entry" placed near Hotel de Havelet in Havelet by the Island Police Committee, downwards;
- (c) La Tourgand, Saint Peter Port, otherwise than from west to east;
- (d) Les Canichers, Saint Peter Port, from its junction with Le Truchot to its junction with Saint Julian's Avenue otherwise than from South to North.

2. In these Regulations the expressions "animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings respectively assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, as amended.

3. (1) These Regulations may be cited as The Road Traffic (One-Way Streets) Regulations, 1964.

(2) These Regulations shall come into force on the third day of July, nineteen hundred and sixty-four and shall operate until the second day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty-five.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate the general purport)

These Regulations re-enact with one alteration the provisions of the Road Traffic (One-Way Streets) Regulations, 1964. The effect of the alteration is to make Havelet, St. Peter Port, a one-way street downwards, from its junction with Hauteville to a sign marked "No Entry" placed near Hotel de Havelet by the Island Police Committee.
