The Motor Cyclists Protective Helmets Order, 1962.

The Island Police Committee in pursuance of the provisions of section one of the Motor Vehicles (Miscellaneous Provisions) Ordinance, 1962, hereby order:-

Protective helmets.

1. Any helmet worn by a motor cyclist in conformity with the provisions of section three of the Motor Vehicles (Miscellaneous Provisions) Ordinance, 1962, shall be dome shaped and consist of a hard smooth shell lined with protective padding material, or fitted with other means of energy absorption, and be strongly attached to a strap designed to fasten under the wearer's chin. The assembled helmet shall have a smooth external surface without either reinforcing ridges or rigid external projections and comply with the requirements specified by the British Standards Institution in British Standard 2001 : 1956, or British Standard 1869 : 1960.

Interpretation Law to apply.

2. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment. *re*

Citation and commencement.

3. This Order may be cited as The Motor Cyclists Protective Helmets Order, 1962, and shall come into force on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and sixty-two.
