The Commonwealth Immigrants (Places of Detention)
(Guernsey) Direction 1962

In pursuance of the power conferred upon me by subsection (1) of section thirteen of the Commonwealth Immigrants Act, 1962, as extended to the Bailiwick of Guernsey by the Commonwealth Immigrants (Guernsey) Order, 1962, I hereby direct as follows -

1. The places in which persons may be detained under the provisions hereinafter mentioned of the Commonwealth Immigrants Act, 1962, as extended to the Bailiwick of Guernsey by the Commonwealth Immigrants (Guernsey) Order, 1962 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") shall be -

- (a) in the case of a person detained under sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 4 of the First Schedule to the Act (which relates to the detention of immigrants pending further examination or removal) who has been required to submit to further examination under that Schedule, any place used by an immigration officer for the purposes of his functions at the port to which that person has landed, or any place specially provided for the purpose of detention at any port;
- (b) in the case of a person detained under the said sub-paragraph who has been refused admission into the Bailiwick under section 2 of the Act, or who is, under sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 8 of the said Schedule (which sub-paragraph relates to seamen in certain circumstances) or sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 9 of the said Schedule (which sub-paragraph relates to stowaways), treated for the purposes of the Act as if he had been refused admission into the Bailiwick, any such place as is mentioned in the preceding sub-paragraph or the Police Station or the States Prison;

(c) in the case of a person detained under sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 2 of the Second Schedule to the Act (which sub-paragraph relates to offenders in respect of whom a recommendation for deportation is in force) or under sub-paragraph (2) of the said paragraph (which sub-paragraph relates to persons in respect of whom a deportation order is in force, the Police Station or the States Prison.

2. A person shall not be detained under the provisions aforesaid for more than five days elsewhere than in the States Prison.

3. In this Direction the expression "port" includes any place where a person lands or embarks in the Bailiwick.

4. This Direction shall come into force on the twenty-third day of July, nineteen hundred and sixty-two.

5. This Direction may be cited as the Commonwealth Immigrants (Places of Detention) (Guernsey) Direction, 1962.
