

The Road Traffic (One-Way Streets) Regulations, 1962.

THE STATES ISLAND POLICE COMMITTEE, in pursuance of the powers conferred on it by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, as amended, and of the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950, and of all other powers thereunto enabling it, hereby makes the following Regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating vehicular traffic in this Island:-

1. A person, being in charge of a vehicle or animal, shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer of Police, proceed with that vehicle or animal on or along -

- (a) Piette Road to its junction with New Paris Road, St. Peter Port, otherwise than from East to West;
- (b) St. Clement's Road, St. Peter Port, otherwise than from North to South.

2. In these Regulations the expressions "animal" and "vehicle" have the meanings respectively assigned to them by Article I of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, as amended.

3. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (One-Way Streets) Regulations, 1962.

(2) These Regulations shall come into force on the thirteenth day of October, nineteen hundred and sixty-two and shall operate until the twelfth day of December, nineteen hundred and sixty two.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport)

These Regulations provide that Piette Road and St. Clement's Road shall be one-way streets. Traffic may only proceed along Piette Road in an upward direction and in St. Clement's Road from St. John's Church toward Piette Road.
