IMPORT AND EXPORT (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) LAW, 1946THE IMPORT AND EXPORT OF GOODS (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1961

The Board of Administration in pursuance of its powers under the Import and Export (Control) (Guernsey) Law, 1946, hereby orders:

1. In the Second Schedule to the Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1955 (a), as amended, the words "Flower bulbs, that is to say, bulbs, corms or rhizomes normally cultivated for their bloom or blossom, in consignments of more than 56 lbs." are hereby deleted.
2. The Delegation of Power to grant Export Licences Order, 1955 (b), is hereby revoked.
3. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.
4. This Order may be cited as the Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) (Amendment) Order, 1961, and shall come into force on the 31st day of December, 1961.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is for information only and forms no part of the Order).
The effect of the above Order is that as from the 31st December, 1961, there will be no restrictions on the exportation of flower bulbs, corms or rhizomes normally cultivated for their bloom or blossom to the United Kingdom, the Island of Jersey, the other Islands of the Bailiwick of Guernsey or the Isle of Man.
