The Road Traffic (Market Place and Market Street Parking)
Regulations, 1960.

THE Island Police Committee in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Traffic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, 1929, as amended, and of the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating vehicular traffic in this Island.

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle, other than a motor delivery vehicle, shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer of Police, allow that vehicle to remain in Market Place or Market Street, in the parish of Saint Peter Port, during the hours in which the Public Markets are open for business.

2. For the purposes of these Regulations the expression "motor delivery vehicle" means any vehicle which is designed or constructed for use wholly or mainly for the carriage of goods.

3. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Market Place and Market Street Parking) Regulations, 1960.

(2) These Regulations shall come into force on the twenty fifth day of June, 1960.

Explanatory Note.

(This note is for information only and does not form any part of the above Regulations).

The effect of these Regulations is that during normal Market hours, Parking Places Nos. 15 and 15a, which extend from the entrance of the Lower Vegetable Market adjoining The Fisheries to the top of Market Street is reserved for motor delivery vehicles only.
