THE ALIENS (FORMER SOMALI BRITISH PROTECTED PERSONS)
Direction, 1960

THE STATES BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by section twenty-two of the Aliens Restriction (Guernsey) Law, 1958, with the consent of the Lieutenant-Governor and Commander-in-Chief, hereby gives the following Direction:-

1. An alien to whom this Direction applies shall, until the first day of July, nineteen hundred and sixty-one, be exempt from the following provisions of the Aliens Restriction (Guernsey) Law, 1958, that is to say, from -
 - (a) sub-paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section four (which provides that an immigration officer shall not grant leave to land to an alien proposing to enter the employment of a particular employer in the Bailiwick unless the alien produces a permit issued to the employer by or under the authority of the States Board of Administration); and
 - (b) sections thirteen to sixteen, both inclusive (which provide for the registration of aliens).
2. This Direction applies to any alien ordinarily resident in the Bailiwick on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and sixty, who immediately before the grant of independence to the Somaliland Protectorate on that day was a British protected person for the purposes of the British Nationality Act, 1948, by virtue of his connection with that Protectorate.
3. (1) This Direction may be cited as the Aliens (Former Somali British Protected Persons) Direction, 1960.
(2) This Direction shall come into force on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and sixty.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Direction but is intended to indicate its general purport)

This Direction provides that during the year following the grant of independence to the Somaliland Protectorate on 1st July, 1960, former Somali British protected persons ordinarily resident in the Bailiwick on that date shall be exempted from certain provisions of the Aliens Restriction (Guernsey) Law, 1958.
