THE IMPORT AND EXPORT OF GOODS (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1955OPEN GENERAL IMPORT LICENCESPENST

WHEREAS by the Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1955, dated the 14th June, 1955, (a), the importation into Guernsey of goods consigned from a place outside the United Kingdom, the Island of Jersey, the other Islands of the Bailiwick of Guernsey or the Isle of Man is prohibited unless under the authority of a licence granted by or on behalf of the Board of Administration:

NOW THEREFORE, the Board of Administration, in exercise of its powers under Article 2. of the above-mentioned Order, hereby revokes the Open General Import Licence dated the 21st day of October, 1958, and the Amendment thereto and the Open General Import Licence (No. 2) dated the 25th day of November, 1958, and grants the following Open General Import Licence:-

General Licence

1. Subject to the following provisions of this Licence:-

Scheduled Territories

- (1) any goods other than goods of a description included in Part I of the First Schedule hereto and therein indicated by the letter X may be imported into Guernsey if they originate in and are consigned from the Scheduled Territories;

Relaxation Area

- (2) any goods other than goods of a description included in the said Part I may be imported as aforesaid if they originate in and are consigned from the Relaxation Area;

Japan

- (3) (i) any goods other than goods of a description included in Part I or Part II of the said Schedule may be imported as aforesaid -
- (a) if they originate in Japan and are consigned from Japan or the Relaxation Area, or
- (b) if they originate in the Relaxation Area and are consigned from Japan;
- (ii) any goods other than goods of a description included in the said Schedule may be imported as aforesaid -
- (a) if they originate in Japan and are consigned from the Dollar Area, or
- (b) if they originate in the Dollar Area and are consigned from Japan;

Dollar Area

- (4) any goods other than goods of a description included in Part I or Part III of the said Schedule may be imported as aforesaid -
- (a) if they originate in the Dollar Area and are consigned from that Area or the Relaxation Area, or
- (b) if they originate in the Relaxation Area and are consigned from the Dollar Area;

Eastern Area

- (5) any goods of a description included in the Second Schedule hereto may be imported as aforesaid if they originate in or are consigned from the Eastern Area.

Special provision in Schedules

2. Paragraph 1 of this Licence shall have effect subject to any special qualifications, restrictions or extensions indicated in either of the Schedules hereto.

Value

3. Where a reference to the value of any goods appears in either Schedule hereto, it shall be construed as a reference to their value computed in accordance with the Import Duties Law, 1932, (b), as amended, as if they were goods on which a duty of customs is chargeable by reference to their value.

Origin - fish, etc.

4. Fish, whales and other natural produce of the sea taken at sea and goods produced or manufactured therefrom at sea shall be regarded for the purposes of this Licence as originating in the country or territory to which the ship by which they were taken or in which they were produced or manufactured belongs; and if they are brought direct to Guernsey they shall be regarded as consigned from that country or territory. A registered ship shall be deemed to belong to the country or territory in which it is registered.

Consignment - Lourenço Marques and Beira

5. Goods consigned from Lourenço Marques or Beira and originating in the Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland or the Bechuanaland Protectorate and goods consigned from Lourenço Marques and originating in the Union of South Africa or Swaziland shall be regarded for the purposes of paragraph 1 hereof as consigned from the Scheduled Territories.

Interpretation

6. For the purposes of this Licence:-
- (a) "Relaxation Area" means all countries and territories (other than Japan) not for the time being included in the Dollar Area or the Eastern Area (as hereinafter defined);
  - (b) "Dollar Area" means Bolivia, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, the Republic of Honduras, Liberia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, the Philippines, the United States of America and Venezuela;
  - (c) "Eastern Area" means Albania, Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, Germany (Soviet Zone), Hungary, North Korea, North Vietnam, Poland, Roumania and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics; and
  - (d) "Scheduled Territories" means any country or territory which is for the time being one of the scheduled territories as defined in the Exchange Control Act, 1947(c) as extended to the Channel Islands by the Exchange Control (Channel Islands) Order, 1947, and, for the purposes of this licence, goods originating in or consigned from Muscat and Oman shall be treated as if they were goods originating in or consigned from the Scheduled Territories.

This Licence shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of August nineteen hundred and fifty-nine.

FIRST SCHEDULE

(General Note:- (1) The issue of this Open General Import Licence does not relieve importers from compliance with any other restrictions to which the goods may be subject, including restrictions on, or the prohibition of, imports by any enactment other than Orders made under Article 1 of the Import and Export (Control) (Guernsey) Law, 1946.

(2) No description in this Schedule shall be deemed to refer to goods which are proved to the satisfaction of the Board of Administration to have been manufactured or produced more than one hundred years before the date of importation).

PART I

Amusement and fairground machinery and parts thereof, other than musical instruments.

Animal feeding stuffs containing more than 80 per cent. by weight of milk solids.

X...Arms and ammunition, the following:-

- (i) firearms, lethal, including any lethal barrelled weapon of any description from which any shot, bullet or other missile can be discharged and other weapons of whatever description designed or adapted for the discharge of any noxious liquid, gas or other thing;
- (ii) component parts (other than wooden gun stocks) of any such firearm or other weapon as aforesaid and any accessory to any such firearm or other weapon designed or adapted to diminish the noise or flash caused by firing the weapon; and
- (iii) ammunition, including grenades, bombs and other like missiles, and any ammunition, containing or designed or adapted to contain any noxious liquid, gas or other thing and component parts of any such ammunition;

other than the following:-

- (a) smooth bore guns having a barrel not less than twenty inches in length measured from the muzzle to the point at which the charge is exploded on firing;
- (b) cartridges therefor containing five or more shots, none of which exceeds nine-twenty-fifths of an inch in diameter;
- (c) blank cartridges not exceeding one inch in diameter for use in smooth bore weapons;
- (d) air guns, air rifles or air pistols and ammunition therefor.

Baskets and basketware (other than furniture) of cane, willow or wicker.

X...Cameras and parts thereof, other than the following and, where stated, parts thereof:-

Cameras, astronomical.

Cameras, motion (motor or spring driven) whether incorporating sound recording apparatus or not and parts thereof, except lenses.

Cameras, still, and parts thereof, consigned from and constructed solely from parts manufactured and assembled in any Scheduled Territory.

Chain and chain cable, cast, forged or welded, of iron or steel (including alloy steel) under 1 inch in diameter, other than:-

Jack chain (including mattress chain), Victor chain and plumbers', chandelier and ball chain.

Steel transmission chain.

X...Clocks, watches and other mechanical timing devices and parts thereof,

- other than the following and, where stated, parts thereof:-
- Clock and watch glasses, including those of synthetic material.
- Clock cases of onyx.
- Clocks, cuckoo.
- Clocks, electric, cased, of a kind used for household purposes.
- Clock springs.
- Metronomes.
- Taximeters and parts thereof.

Those consigned from and constructed solely from parts manufactured and assembled in any Scheduled Territory.

Coal, coke and solid fuels manufactured from coal or coke.

Outlery, forks and spoons (other than bone manufactures and medical, surgical and dental, veterinary and dissecting instruments), the following and parts thereof:-

- Butchers' steels.
- Cuticle clippers and nippers.
- Forks and spoons wholly or partly of metal.
- Hair clippers (non-electric).
- Knives.
- Manicure sets, other than nail cleaners, nail files and nail polishers.
- Nail clippers and nail pliers.
- Razor blades.
- Razors and shavers, non-electric.
- Scissors, including tailors' shears and pinking shears.
- Secateurs and pruning shears.

Dies, diamond wire drawing.

X...Dyes, dyestuffs and intermediates, the following:-

- (i) synthetic organic dyestuffs (including pigment dyestuffs), whether soluble or insoluble;
- (ii) compounds, preparations and articles manufactured from any such dyestuffs, other than <sup>any</sup> such compounds, preparations and articles as are not suitable for use in dyeing; and
- (iii) organic intermediate products imported for the manufacture of any such dyestuffs.

X...Feathers of birds and articles consisting wholly or partly of feathers,

other than the following, which may be imported provided that a written declaration has been delivered to the proper officer of the States of Guernsey Customs, containing a statement that the goods fall within these categories and a description of the goods sufficient to support that statement:-

- (i) Feathers of birds ordinarily used in the United Kingdom as articles of diet.
- (ii) Feathers of the following birds:-

- African ostrich.
- Eider duck.
- Rhea Rothschildi - Order Rheiformes.
- Common jay (Garrulus Flandarius) - Order Passeriformes.
- Common magpie (Pica Pica) - Order Passeriformes.
- Common starling (Sturnus Vulgaris) - Order Passeriformes.
- Java sparrow (Munia Oryzivora) - Order Passeriformes.
- West African ring-necked parrakeet (Palaeornis Docilis) - Order Psittaciformes.
- Chinese bustard (Otis Tarda Dybowskyi) - Order Charadriiformes.
- Golden pheasant (Crysolophus Pictus) - Order Galliformes.
- Common cormorant (Phalacrocorax Carbo) - Order Steganopodes.
- Common shag (Phalacrocorax Aristotelis) - Order Steganopodes.

- (iii) Trimmings, millinery mounts and other articles made wholly or partly of feathers of the birds specified at (i) and (ii) above.

(ii) Goods originating in and consigned from Canada.

Fruit, the following:-

Apples and pears, fresh.

Apples and mixtures of fruit containing apple, bottled or canned.

X..... Fruit, bottled or canned, and fruit pulp (including bulk frozen fruit) of the following varieties:-

Peach,

Pear,

Pineapple, and

Mixtures containing any of these varieties,

other than fruit grown (or pulp derived from fruit grown) in the country or territory from which it is consigned.

Glassware, the following:-

Glassware decorated by cutting (including intaglio cutting), engraving, etching or gold enamelling, other than mirrors and illuminating glassware (except lamp stems, lamp bases and candlesticks).

- (i) Lenses, prisms and other optical elements, whether mounted or not; sheets and plates of polarising material, and mirrors optically worked; other than illuminating glassware, magnifiers and spectacle lenses and blanks.
- (ii) Optical instruments and parts thereof (being instruments which depend principally on the use of goods mentioned in (i) above, other than the following and, where stated, parts thereof:-
  - Binoculars, Galilean or Prismatic, of a value not exceeding £7. 10s. 0d. each.
  - Bubbles (for levels, etc.).

Unset real pearls, unset precious and semi-precious stones and unmounted cameos.

Milk (including buttermilk, skim milk and whey), fresh, frozen, evaporated, condensed, dried or otherwise preserved.

Paper, paperboard and cellulose wrapping and manufactures thereof, the following:-

Paper, paperboard and cellulose wrapping, printed or embossed.

Paper manufactures, being articles consisting wholly or mainly of paper, of board made from paper or pulp, or of cellulose wrapping, the following:-

Boxes, bags and cartons (other than trunks and other receptacles of material resembling leather, powder boxes and women's handbags).

Calendars, diaries, stamp and photograph albums and scrap books.

Children's picture cut out and painting books.

Handkerchiefs, serviettes, towels (other than sanitary towels) and toilet paper.

(i) New potatoes, being potatoes which have been dug immature for marketing without delay and are imported during the period from 1st November of any one year to 31st August of the next.

(ii) Poultry carcasses including any part of any such carcass;

Toys of all kinds (other than harmonicas containing six or more tuned reeds) and parts thereof.

Stationery and office requisites and parts thereof (including chalks, crayons, pastels, fountain pens and pencil sharpeners), other than:-

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Licence but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This Licence revokes the Open General Import Licences granted by the Board of Administration in October and November, 1958 respectively and replaces them by a single licence.

The main change effected is in relation to the Dollar Area. Any goods other than goods of a description included in Part I or Part III of the First Schedule may now be imported without individual import licence if they originate in the Dollar Area and are consigned from that Area or the Relaxation Area, or if they originate in the Relaxation Area and are consigned from the Dollar Area.

Consequential changes have also been made regarding the consignment of Dollar Area goods from Japan and Japanese goods from the Dollar Area.

A number of minor alterations have been made in the description of goods which may be imported under open general licence. The general effect of these is to reduce the cases in which individual import licences are needed.
