The Road Traffic (Mountain Street Parking) Regulations, 1959.

THE Island Police Committee in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Article X of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Traffic Vehiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, 1929, as amended, and of the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following regulations in order to ascertain the best method of regulating vehicular traffic in this Island.

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle shall not, without the permission in writing of the Chief Officer of Police, leave such vehicle in Mountain Street, in the parish of St. Peter Port, for any continuous period greater than a period of fifteen minutes in any continuous period of sixty minutes during the hours in which the Public Markets are open for business otherwise than for such period as may be reasonably necessary for loading or unloading that vehicle.

2. In these regulations the expression "vehicle" shall have the meaning respectively assigned to it by Article 1 of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Traffic Vehiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, 1929, as amended.

3. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Mountain Street Parking) Regulations, 1959.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the sixteenth day of November, 1959.

Explanatory Note.

(This note is for information only and does not form any part of the above regulations).

The effect of these regulations is to prohibit a person from leaving a vehicle in Mountain Street for more than a continuous period of fifteen minutes in any period of sixty minutes during the hours when the Public Markets are open otherwise than for the purposes of loading and unloading.
