THE EXPORT OF PRODUCE (OTHER THAN TOMATOES) ORDER, 1958

The States Committee for Horticulture, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (2) of section four of the Export of Produce (Other than Tomatoes) (Packing and Grading) Ordinance, 1956, as amended, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order:-

1. The Export of Produce (Other than Tomatoes) Order, 1956 (a), is hereby amended as follows:-

- (i) section two thereof is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor -

"2. The imprint on or label attached to a container, in pursuance of subsection (1) of section four of the principal Ordinance, containing produce shall, in the case of produce consigned to -

- (a) London, be white;
- (b) Birmingham, be green;
- (c) Manchester, be red;
- (d) every other place in England, be buff;
- (e) every place in Wales, be blue;
- (f) every place in Scotland be yellow."

- (ii) in subsection (2) of section three thereof a semi-colon is hereby substituted for the full-stop after the word "yellow" and the following is hereby added -

"(e) Brentford Market, be black." .

2. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall apply to the Interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st January, 1959.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport)

This Order, which comes into operation on the 1st January, 1959, amends the Export of Produce (Other than Tomatoes) Order, 1956, to the extent that destination labels for produce, other than tomatoes, sent to London must be white instead of buff and that labels for produce sent to Brentford Market must be marked with black lines forming a diagonal cross.
