THE PLANTS AND POTATOES IMPORTATION ORDER, 1958.

The States Committee for Horticulture, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon them by section six of the Plants and Potatoes Importation Ordinance, 1951, as amended, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order:-

1. The Plants and Potatoes Importation (No. 2) Order, 1953 (a), as amended (b), is hereby further amended as follows:-

(a) paragraph (iii) of section one thereof is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor:-

"(iii) raw fruit other than raw cherries shall be permitted provided that -

(a) in respect of raw apples grown in the United States of America landed or transhipped during the period commencing on the seventh day of July and ending on the fifteenth day of November of any year they are of one or more of the following grades as recognised by the Department of Agriculture of the United States of America, namely, "U.S. Fancy", "U.S. No. 1", "Extra Fancy" and "Fancy", and they are accompanied by a certificate in the form set out in the Seventh Schedule to this Order; and

(b) in respect of raw apples, apricots, greengages, nectarines, peaches, pears or plums grown in any country in the Continent of Europe other than Belgium, Denmark, Finland, Luxembourg, Norway, Sweden and the Netherlands, each consignment thereof has been examined by an authorised officer of the Phytopathological Service of the country in which the fruit was grown and has been found by him to be free from San José scale (*Quadraspidiotus perniciosus* Comst.) and substantially free from all species of Lepidoptera, including Oriental Fruit Moth (*Laspeyresia molesta* (Busk)) and is accompanied by a certificate in the form set out in the Seventh Schedule to this Order;"

(b) in section three thereof the words "or Sixth" are hereby repealed and the words "Sixth or Seventh" substituted therefor;

(c) the Fifth Schedule thereto is hereby repealed;

(d) immediately after the Sixth Schedule thereto there is hereby inserted as the Seventh Schedule thereto the Schedule to this Order.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport)

This Order further amends the Plants and Potatoes Importation (No. 2) Order, 1953. It prescribes a new form of certificate which is required to accompany consignments of apples imported from the United States of America and removes the restrictions in relation to Colorado beetle on the importation of cider apples from the Continent of Europe, the United States of America and the Dominion of Canada.

The Order also requires each consignment of apples, apricots, greengages, nectarines, peaches, pears or plums grown in certain European countries to be examined before despatch and found free from San José scale and substantially free from all species of Lepidoptera including Oriental Fruit Moth. Each such consignment is required to be accompanied by a certificate in the form prescribed in the Order.
