The Milk Prices (Guernsey) (No. 1) Order, 1957*limited duration*

The States Dairy Committee, in pursuance of a Resolution of the States of the nineteenth day of September, nineteen hundred and fifty-six and of a Resolution of the twenty-fourth day of April, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven, and under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon them by Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order:-

1. (1) Subject to the succeeding provisions of this Order, during the twelve calendar months beginning on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven, the price to be paid by the Committee to milk producers for milk, produced locally, which is not surplus to the Island's milk requirements purchased by the Committee and thereafter classified by the Committee as Grade 1 milk shall be, during the periods set out in the left-hand column of the Schedule to this Order, the prices set out in the right-hand column of that Schedule respectively.

(2) The prices set out in the right-hand column of the Schedule to this Order may, from time to time, be varied by the Committee in such manner as will ensure that an average price of two shillings, five pence and one halfpenny per pot shall be paid to milk producers collectively in respect of milk, produced locally, which is not surplus to the Island's milk requirements during the period beginning on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven, and ending on the thirtieth day of April, nineteen hundred and fifty-eight, both dates inclusive.

2. The price to be paid by the Committee to milk producers for milk, produced locally, which is surplus to the Island's milk requirements purchased by the Committee during the twelve calendar months beginning on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven, shall be at such reasonable commercial rate per pot as the Committee shall from time to time determine, and any such surplus shall be deemed to have been produced by all the milk producers so that payments therefor shall be made in proportion to the quantity of milk sent to the States Dairy by each milk producer.

3. In addition to the prices to be paid for non surplus milk and surplus milk under the foregoing provisions of this Order there shall be paid during the twelve calendar months beginning on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven, to producers whose whole herd, other than cows exempt from the provisions of the Milk and Butterfat Recording Scheme administered by the Royal Guernsey Agricultural and Horticultural Society, is registered with that Society for the purposes of that Scheme, a subsidy which shall be paid each fortnight at the rate of one penny per pot for all milk purchased from them by the Committee from the first day of May, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven, or, if the herd is not so registered on that date, from the date of registration.

4. The price to be paid by individual milk retailers to the Committee as regards milk, whether produced locally or imported, shall be at the rate of two shillings, five pence and one halfpenny per pot, subject to:-

- (a) a rebate of $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per pot on milk purchased up to and including the first thousand pots per week;
- (b) a rebate of $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per pot on purchases of milk from 1,001 up to and including 2,000 pots per week, with no rebate thereafter;

during the twelve calendar months commencing on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven.

5. The price to be paid by consumers to retailers as regards milk, whether produced locally or imported and whether delivered at the residence of the consumer or otherwise, shall be at the rate of eight pence and one halfpenny per pint during the twelve calendar months commencing on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven.

6. For the purposes of this Order, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them -

"the Committee" means the States Dairy Committee;

"pot" means four pints;

"milk" means the milk, in its natural state, of a cow and includes such milk after pasteurization;

"milk which is not surplus to the Island's milk requirements" means milk which is sold to the consumer at retail price, and the expression "milk which is surplus to the Island's milk requirements" shall be construed accordingly.

7. This Order may be cited as the Milk Prices (Guernsey) (No.1) Order, 1957, and shall come into force on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven.
