

THE FUEL (MAXIMUM PRICES) (GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1956

Revoked by S.I. 1958 No 31 1956 No. 5.

Made ... .. 28th March, 1956
Coming into Operation 1st April, 1956.

As Competent Authority as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney, in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, I hereby make the following Order as regards the Island of Guernsey:-

1. (1) In this Order -

"buy" includes offer or agree to buy, and "sell" includes agree to sell or expose for sale.

"imported" means imported from the United Kingdom.

(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.

- 2. No person shall buy or sell any fuel of a description appearing in the Schedule to this Order at a price exceeding the price applicable thereto in accordance with the provisions of the said Schedule.
3. This Order shall not apply in relation to fuel imported for horticultural purposes.
4. The Fuel (Maximum Prices) (Guernsey) Order, 1955, is hereby revoked, but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention thereof.
5. This Order may be cited as the Fuel (Maximum Prices) (Guernsey) Order, 1956, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1956.

THE SCHEDULE
