THE EXPORT OF PRODUCE (OTHER THAN TOMATOES) ORDER, 1956

THE STATES COMMITTEE FOR HORTICULTURE, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (2) of section four of the Export of Produce (Other than Tomatoes) (Packing and Grading) Ordinance, 1956, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order:-

1. Where the place of destination of produce is, in pursuance of the provisions of subsection (1) of section four of the Export of Produce (Other than Tomatoes) (Packing and Grading) Ordinance, 1956 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"), imprinted on a container of produce or marked on a label attached to such a container it shall be so imprinted or marked in letters larger than the letters indicating the name of the consignee.

2. The imprint on or label attached to a container, in pursuance of subsection (1) of section four of the principal Ordinance, containing produce shall, in the case of produce consigned to -

- (a) Birmingham, be green;
- (b) Manchester, be red;
- (c) every other place in England, be buff;
- (d) every place in Wales, be blue;
- (e) every place in Scotland, be yellow.

3. (1) Where a container containing produce is to be exported to any of the places in London set out in the next succeeding subsection, the imprint on such a container or the label attached thereto in pursuance of subsection (1) of section four of the principal Ordinance shall, in the former case, consist of lines forming a design as set out in the Schedule to this Order and, in the latter case, have that design marked on the label; the lines forming such design being of such colour as is set out in the next succeeding subsection according to the place of destination also set out therein.

(2) The lines forming the design referred to in the last preceding subsection shall, in the case of produce consigned to -

- (a) Borough Market, be green;
- (b) Covent Garden, be red;
- (c) Spitalfields Market, be blue;
- (d) Stratford Market, be yellow.

4. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the eleventh day of June, nineteen hundred and fifty-six.
