

IMPORT AND EXPORT (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) LAW, 1946THE IMPORT AND EXPORT OF GOODS (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1955OPEN GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE

WHEREAS by the Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1955, dated the 14th June, 1955, (a), the importation into Guernsey of goods consigned from a place outside the United Kingdom, the Island of Jersey, the other Islands of the Bailiwick of Guernsey or the Isle of Man is prohibited unless under the authority of a licence granted by or on behalf of the Board of Administration.

(1) Now, therefore, the Board of Administration, in exercise of its powers under Article 2 of the above-mentioned Order, hereby authorises and permits:-

- (a) The importation into Guernsey from any country of all goods specified in Schedule I hereto.
- (b) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Schedule II hereto, if consigned from and originating in any country or territory other than Bolivia, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Ecuador, Guatemala, Haiti, Republic of Honduras, Liberia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Philippines, United States of America, Venezuela.
- (c) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Schedule III hereto, if consigned from and originating in any country or territory other than Albania, Argentina, Bolivia, Bulgaria, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Germany (Russian Zone), Guatemala, Haiti, Republic of Honduras, Hungary, Japan, Korea, Liberia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Philippines, Poland, Roumania, United States of America, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, Venezuela.
- (d) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Schedule IV hereto, if consigned from and originating in any country or territory other than Albania, Argentina, Bolivia, Bulgaria, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Germany (Russian Zone), Guatemala, Haiti, Republic of Honduras, Hungary, Japan, Korea, Liberia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Philippines, Poland, Roumania, United States of America, Venezuela.
- (e) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Schedule V hereto, according to the conditions contained in the said Schedule and provided that they are not consigned from Albania, Argentina, Bolivia, Bulgaria, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Germany, (Russian Zone), Guatemala, Haiti, Republic of Honduras, Hungary, Japan, Korea, Liberia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Philippines, Poland, Roumania, United States of America, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, Venezuela.

- (f) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Schedule VI hereto, if consigned from and originating in any of the following countries or territories:-

Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Union of South Africa, India, Pakistan, Ceylon, Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland, any colony, being part of Her Majesty's Dominions, any United Kingdom protectorate or protected state, any territory for the time being administered by the Government of any part of Her Majesty's Dominions under the trusteeship system of the United Nations, South West Africa, Irish Republic, Burma.

- (g) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Schedule VII hereto, if consigned from and originating in the particular countries referred to in such Schedule.
- (h) The importation into Guernsey of all goods other than those specified in Schedule VIII hereto, if consigned from and originating in the Scheduled Territories, Muscat and Oman,
- (i) The importation into Guernsey of postage stamps and other items of philatelic interest, according to the conditions specified in Schedule IX hereto.
- (j) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Schedule X hereto, if consigned from or taken by vessels registered in such countries as are referred to in such schedule.

(2) The Open General Import Licence dated the 27th July, 1954, is hereby revoked.

(3) This Licence shall take effect on the 26th day of August, 1955, and may be modified or revoked at any time by the Board of Administration.
