THE FATS AND CHEESE (RATIONING) (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY)
(AMENDMENT NO. 6) ORDER, 1953.

Made 17th December, 1953.

Coming into Operation ... 20th December, 1953.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

1. The Fats and Cheese (Rationing) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1953 (a) as amended (b), shall be further amended by adding to Part III thereof, relating to cheese, the following paragraph:-

"(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order or in the Principal Order, where a surplus of cheese is held by a retailer, from cheese he is authorised by permit G.P.2 or Misc. 2 to obtain for supply to his registered customers or to establishments as the case may be, after having supplied the lawful requirements of those customers and establishments the retailer may supply any such surplus cheese to any person ration free, and any person may obtain any such cheese from the retailer ration free."

2. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.

3. This Order may be cited as the Fats and Cheese (Rationing) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (Amendment No. 6) Order, 1953, and shall come into operation on the 20th day of December, 1953.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This amending Order enables retailers who hold any surplus cheese, from cheese authorised for supply on the ration to registered customers and establishments, after having supplied the lawful requirements of those customers and establishments to sell such surplus ration free to anyone.
