THE FOOD RATIONING (GENERAL PROVISIONS) (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY)  
(AMENDMENT NO. 2) ORDER, 1954.

Made ... .. 21st January, 1954.  
Coming into Operation ... 24th January, 1954.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

1. The Food Rationing (General Provisions) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1953 (a) as amended (b), shall be further amended as follows:-

- (a) by deleting from paragraph (1) of Article 1 of the Order the definition of resident;
- (b) by deleting therefrom Article 11 and sub-paragraph (a)(i) of paragraph (1) of Article 13 thereof;
- (c) by substituting for Article 12 thereof, relating to the surrender of residents' ration documents by establishments, the following Article:-

"12. (1) Where a person shall have spent twenty-eight consecutive nights in an establishment, or twenty-eight consecutive days in the case of a person who owing to the nature of his occupation sleeps during the day and works during the night, he shall forthwith deliver his ration document to the licensee of that establishment and the licensee shall so deliver the ration document to the Committee unless the resident shall have furnished to the licensee a declaration in writing that he intends to cease to reside in the establishment within fourteen days. If a person who has given such a declaration shall not have ceased to reside in the establishment within such period the licensee shall forthwith deliver the ration document of such resident to the Committee.

(2) Nothing in this Article shall require the delivery to or by the licensee of any establishment of (a) a Ration Book R.B.7, (b) a Child's Ration Book R.B.2 where the holder thereof is a child whose age (ascertained from the relevant entry in page 1 of the book) is less than six months, or (c) any ration document where the holder thereof is an overseas visitor (that is to say, any person who has arrived in the Bailiwick of Guernsey on a visit from some place outside the British Islands) and who has not been in the British Islands on the occasion of that visit for a period exceeding thirteen weeks."

2. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.

3. This Order may be cited as the Food Rationing (General Provisions) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (Amendment No. 2) Order, 1954, and shall come into operation on the 24th day of January, 1954.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This amending Order, which comes into force on the 24th January, 1954, frees licensees of establishments from the necessity of cancelling coupons in ration documents of residents and from the necessity of keeping records of meals served, but requires the delivery to the Committee of ration documents of people who have been residents for a continuous period of twenty-eight nights or days, unless the resident concerned declares his intention to cease to reside in the establishment within a further fourteen days.
